Crime Stoppers

A family on the way to a quinceanera stopped for gasoline and, while there, had their vehicle attacked by two suspects, making this the Crime Stoppers "Crime of the Week." On Saturday, March 31, 2012, at 7:00 p.m., the father of the family was filling up with gas in the Diamond Shamrock station at 3898 Doniphan and Sunland Park when he saw his son run out of the station store yelling and followed by a suspect with a knife in his hand. The son got into the car and the father tried to drive off as the suspect attempted to slash the vehicle's tire and then stabbed at the vehicle hood. At the same time, another suspect punched at the passenger side door. The family was able to escape. Detectives from the Police Department's Crimes Against Persons unit determined that, while inside the store, the suspect who had the knife was noticing the wife in the car, which angered the son; and that's when the suspect took out his knife and began chasing the son out of the store. That suspect is described as an Hispanic man, 5'9", with a thin build, shaved head, white t-shirt and brown shorts, and tattooed "sleeves" on his arms. The other suspect, also Hispanic, was 6' tall, heavy build, shaved head, in brown nursing scrubs with tattooed "sleeves" on his arms. Socorro High School teachers sweep Krispy Kreme Teacher of the Year contest

Three Socorro High School teachers achieved a first in the Krispy Kreme Teacher of the Year contest this school year. They were the first to be the top three winners all from one school and one school district, said Randy Willard, owner of Krispy Kreme Doughnuts in San Antonio, Austin, San Marcos, Laredo and El Paso.

The winners in the 2012 El Paso Krispy Kreme Teacher of the Year contest were Miguel Rivera, first place winner; Margaret McCarthy, first runner up; and Elva Vazquez, third runner up. The three winners in the El Paso contest were surprised with an awards presentation May 1 in the library at Socorro High School.

"I was pleasantly surprised," said Rivera, a government, economics and U.S. history teacher. "It was unexpected and I am extremely proud... because it was from

student nominations. That's the most flattering part of it."

The Krispy Kreme Teacher of the Year award is based on nominations from students, fellow teachers, parents and administrators. All three teachers were extremely grateful to be acknowledged by the Socorro community and Krispy Kreme.

"It is a great honor. It shows everything I do for the kids pays off," said McCarthy, a 10th through 12th-grade math teacher. "They recognize my dedication to them and all the hard work I put in for them and the hard work they put in to be successful."

Rivera, McCarthy and Vazquez were recognized in front of their students, several Socorro High School faculty and staff, principal Miguel Serrano and superintendent Dr. Xavier De La Torre. After the awards ceremony, students and staff were treated to Krispy Kreme donuts and Price's Creamery milk. Price's Creamery is a partner in the Teacher of the Year program.

"This honor is probably bigger than the

campus teacher of the year because it covers a bigger geographical area and it comes straight from my students," said Vazquez, a health occupations teacher. "It is gratitude from them in a very public forum."

This is the fourth year of the Krispy Kreme Teacher of the Year program in select Texas cities and is celebrated in honor of National Teacher Day in May. El Paso had the most nominations from all the cities with almost 150 nominations for teachers in the greater El Paso area.

The top 10 nominations were then given to an assistant principal in San Antonio who judged them to select the top winners, Willard said. The first place winner earned \$500, the first runner up earned \$250 and the second runner up earned \$100. In addition, the same amounts will be awarded to Socorro High School.

"We wanted to give back to our community," Willard said about the Teacher of the Year contest. "These teachers give a lot to their students. They need recognition and this is our opportunity to do that."

La Fe, San Vicente receive \$7 million in federal grants to improve health care

As part of the new federal health care law, the Department of Health & Human Services (HHS) awarded recently two grants to Centro de Salud Familiar La Fe totaling \$4,789,395 and a continuing grant to Centro San Vicente for \$2,685,479.

The grants are intended to help build, expand and improve community health centers in the El Paso region, according to U.S. Congressman Silvestre Reyes.

Centro de Salud Familiar La Fe Chief Executive Officer Salvador Balcorta stated, "The impact of this grant funding is immeasurable. True quality of life begins and ends with our community's right to health. This funding paves the way for Centro de Salud Familiar La Fe to put our latest community-health

programs into action."

As a result of the grants, Balcorta stated that La Fe would be able to break ground soon in San Elizario to build a new, brick and mortar community-health center that will be four times larger than the current, 16-year-old modular facility, and that the La Fe Central Clinic in South El Paso would also soon have access to state-of-the-art, digital x-ray equipment and an expanded, modern laboratory-services area.

La Fe provides low-income families with access to quality preventive and primary health care services. With nine primary clinics and over 300 qualified medical, dental, nursing, support, and community health professionals serving in the El Paso-area, La Fe has provided medical and dental services to over 23,000 clients in the community. Because La Fe is located in a Medically Underserved Area

(MUA) and Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA), designated by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, La Fe can compete for federal grants to help provide critical health care services for the El Paso community.

The continuing grant will help

improve San Vicente's procedures and operations such as X-ray examinations, lab tests, behavioral services and oral health services through the Health Centers Cluster program.

The Health Center Cluster Program





Charges were filed a short time later. Montelongo knows he is wanted and is believed to remain in the Borderland. He has a criminal history that includes violence and weapons. You can take a big step forward in getting help for yourself or a veteran family member by going to the VA's website, www.mentalhealth.va.gov. Click on:

- Screening tools: You'll find screening tests for depression, PTSD and substance abuse, including drugs and alcohol.
- Where to get help: Click on the green HELP graphic, and you'll find tabs for getting help right now (if you are in crisis, call 1-800-273-8255 and press "1"), program locators and treatment info. Click on the map graphic to find the nearest VA facility. Use the drop-down menu to find the type of facility you need. There is a special PTSD link on the left side of the screen.

can get to a computer, consider checking in with the Veterans Crisis Online chat. Someone is there 24 hours a day. Go to www.mentalhealth.va.gov and click Suicide Prevention on the left side of the screen. (Or go to http://veteranscrisisline.net/) You also can send a text message to 838255. You don't have to be enrolled in VA health care to get help.

Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki recently announced that the VA would be adding 1,600 more mental-health clinicians – nurses, psychologists, social workers, psychiatrists – plus 300 more support staff. The need is great – 1.3 million veterans were helped with mental-health services last year – and that number will only increase.

provides financial assistance to individuals who would generally not have access to health care services by funding health centers to support comprehensive primary and preventive health care services to underserved or rural areas. The funds may be used for oral health care, mental health care and substance abuse services.

Centro San Vicente provides community-based primary healthcare with particular concern for the poor and needy. With a coordinated and holistic approach in caring for body,

mind, and spirit, San Vicente offers affordable health care, social service, and health education programs in collaboration with other health, social service, and educational agencies.

“One of the goals of the new health care law is to help community health centers meet the growing demand for health care services,” Reyes said. “Community health centers like La Fe and Centro San Vicente are part of an important system that ensures our most vulnerable community members receive the medical attention they need. These funds will not only help our community health centers care for additional patients but will also create jobs.”

“We get to experience and see many things in El Paso that we didn’t even know were here,” said Zayahary Ortiz.

For Iliana Ortiz she said, “We also got to go to the jail, which was pretty scary.”

The program introduces students to the different career opportunities, which for Zayahary and Iliana, has set them on a path for a career in the medical profession after visiting the hospitals and touring an operating room in full surgical suits.

Junior Leadership El Paso, a program of the Greater El Paso Chamber of Commerce, targets high school juniors and provides them with the opportunity

to meet and interact with El Paso business, government and community leaders. After a review process of ninety-five applications, the Junior Leadership El Paso program announced the roster for Class 9 made up of 41 candidates representing five school districts. The students will participate in a semester long program in seven sessions designed to support their high school education and understand the community’s social and economic issues and opportunities.

• Description of the firm’s design and project management philosophy.

In addition to design excellence, the following criteria will be used for screening a landscape architectural team:

- Interested firms must be able to demonstrate experience with building parks of similar complexity and scale.
- Experience with municipal/client on projects of similar scale.
- Record of park designs, which provide functionality.
- Record of designing parks which are sensitive to site context.
- Record of park designs which use natural building materials effectively.
- Record of designing parks within budget constraints.
- History of effective schedule and budget management.
- Availability of sufficient qualified staff to the project throughout the park development.
- Demonstrated experience in park construction administration.

Interested firms must be able to demonstrate successful experience with public involvement in a project design should have experience with city/county staff at many levels in the planning stages and expect open community review during the design phase. The city may contract with the chosen firm to plan and coordinate public involvement. The selected landscape architectural firm will be expected to work collaboratively with this communications effort.

Best sports apps for your iPad

According to the Gartner Group, purchased some type of tablet more than 66 million people computer last year (myself included).

There are thousands of applications for the iPad, Android and Windows-based tablets. Here are some of the Top 10 apps I've found for the sports fan with an iPad:

10. Flipboard

This just may be the best

application for the iPad, period. It allows users to pick up to 36 websites, Facebook or Twitter accounts and presents them in a magazine-like fashion. While not a sports app per se, it is easy enough to plug in your favorite teams and other sports information sites. Flipboard keeps it all in one central location. I use it every day.

9. Zite

This app is CNN's version of Flipboard, but with a twist. Like Flipboard, it presents the web, Facebook and Twitter like a magazine, but it sorts information by topic instead, and it lets you pick as many of them as you like from a pre-approved list. Again, one convenient location makes it easy and convenient to follow your favorite teams or sport.

8. The Masters

Already outdated for this year, nonetheless, Augusta National came through with a truly excellent app for the most famous golf tournament in the world. Everything you'd expect from an app that focuses solely on one event, at one venue, is included. HD video, detailed maps of each hole and the history of the club and tournament are covered in exquisite detail and during the tournament, the scoreboard is active and there

is a live feed from the course and a highlight reel. This is the standard that every tournament should be measured by.

7. Asphalt 6

This is a racing game that has great graphics and utilizes the iPad's gyroscopic abilities in that you treat the tablet like a steering wheel. It's pretty difficult and very fast-paced. (Don't play it before bed – your adrenaline will keep you up all night, and I speak from experience.) The game is free, and as you win races you earn points and get to upgrade to other car models. I'm not much of a game player, but this one has me hooked.

6. NBC Sports Talk

I've found this to be the best "inside" sports-information app available. The stories are well written, often a bit pithy but usually very insightful. Every major sport is covered in an easy-to-use interface, and it provides a daily schedule, scores, the Vegas line and even lets you buy tickets to an event. Far better than ESPN or any other sports-news app I've found to date.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: What is the difference between dementia and Alzheimer's disease? Are they the same? – M.J.

"Dementia" is an encompassing word that includes many different conditions. Those conditions have some similar features that indicate an impairment or loss of important mental functions. The inability to retain new information, getting lost in familiar surroundings, difficulty choosing the proper words to express oneself, trouble doing simple arithmetic like adding and subtracting, the failure to recognize close relatives and friends, and showing poor judgment like dressing for winter in the middle of summer are signs of dementia.

Alzheimer's disease, Pick's disease, vascular dementia (dementia due to many small strokes), dementia with Lewy bodies and frontotemporal dementia are but a few of the dementia illnesses. Each of these illnesses has special features that set it apart from the other dementing conditions.

Alzheimer's disease is the most common kind of dementia. People often use "dementia" when they mean "Alzheimer's disease." It's best to give the exact name for the illness that is causing mental deterioration.

The booklet on Alzheimer's disease provides the signs and symptoms of this illness. DEAR DR. DONOHUE: What has happened to the appendix? I never hear about appendicitis anymore. Has the operation gone out of fashion? Or is there some other way to deal with it? – R.P.

The appendix is still where it always has been, dangling down

from the first part of the colon on the lower right side. Long thought not to have any purpose, it does appear to add to immune defenses and seems to produce products useful for the development of the fetus. We do well without it, though.

Appendicitis has not gone out of fashion. It happens with the same regularity it always has. The age group most likely to suffer from it is the group between 10 and 19. Around 250,000 appendectomies are done yearly in the United States.

Newer developments in the diagnosis of appendicitis include CT scans and ultrasound. Many surgeons now use a laparoscope to remove it. It's a viewing instrument passed into the abdomen through a small incision. Instruments also are inserted through similar small incisions.

DEAR DR. DONOHUE: I don't think my problem will impress you, but here I go. I refuse to wear a bathing suit in the summer because of all the spider veins on my legs, especially in the area of the ankles. How are they gotten rid of? I heard that tea bags work. Do they? – E.L.

I'm not familiar with tea bags for spider veins.

Other treatments do work well. Lasers can obliterate them. So can sclerotherapy. A doctor injects these tiny veins with a solution that causes them to wither and dry up.

I'm sure you won't have trouble finding a doctor who does these procedures. If you do have trouble, ask your family doctor for a referral.

Social Security Q&A By Ray Vigil

Q: My grandfather, who is receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI), will be coming to live with me. Does he have to report the move to Social Security?

A: Yes. An SSI beneficiary must report any change in living arrangements within 10 days after the month the change occurs. If the change is not reported, your grandfather could receive an incorrect payment and have to pay it back, or he may not receive all the money due. Just as importantly, your grandfather needs to report the new address to Social Security to receive mail from us. You can report the change by mail or in person at any Social Security office or call Social Security's toll-free number at 1-800-772-1213 (TTY: 1-800-325-0778). You can get more information by reading the booklet Understanding SSI, at www.socialsecurity.gov/ssi.


