Arizona Wing takes Sentimental Journey to Santa Teresa

El Paso area residents got a rare opportunity recently to experience one of the most popular and recognized aircrafts of World War II, the B-17 Flying Fortress Sentimental Journey.

The authentic plane made a four-day stop at the Santa Teresa, NM Airport in October to give interested individuals a tour of the flying fortress, and for some an hour flight for \$425.

The visiting aircraft is one of only six B-17 bombers still flying today.

Sentimental Journey is part of the Commemorative Air Force (CAF) touring museums, which were initiated over fifty years ago to showcase examples of every American military aircraft since WWII.

Sentimental Journey is serviced by CAF's Arizona Wing in Mesa, Arizona. The Arizona Wing volunteers maintain this mighty aircraft and keep it in flying condition for its tours across the country throughout the year. The

visiting flight crew members were: Mel Tiensvold, pilot in command; Rich Roberts, co-pilot; Troy Smith, flight crew chief; and Andrew Stemple, load master.

Sentimental Journey's story is a classic one, said Stemple. It rolled off the Douglas assembly line in 1944 and was accepted by the U.S. Army Air Force on March 13, 1945. Manufactured too late to see service in the European war, the aircraft was assigned to the

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



Flu vaccination recommended for majority of population

EL PASO COUNTY - Children are a source of joy, wonder, pride and germs - lots and lots of germs. Studies show that otherwise healthy but unvaccinated daycare and schoolage children are prime targets for influenza, or what is more commonly called "the flu." School populations are eight times denser than offices and 10 times denser than homes, making them prime breeding grounds for the spread of influenza.

Once infected, children shed more of the influenza viruses than do infected adults, and they do so for longer periods of time. This strange but true fact explains why they are so often at the center of an outbreak in the family or the community. When children become infected, unvaccinated household members quickly follow suit, leading to missed school days, missed work, doctor visits and sometimes hospital visits.

A staggering five to 20 percent of the U.S. population gets the flu and more than 200,000 people end up hospitalized due to flu complications and about 36,000 people die each year from influenza.

Immunize El Paso is working with each

of El Paso's area schools to bring their influenza vaccination outreach campaign to the community. This campaign encourages everyone to avoid the potentially severe consequences of influenza by learning what can be done to prevent infection.

These are some simple steps to take to keep yourselves, your loved ones and those around you as healthy as possible during flu season:

- Get your flu shot. Every year a new vaccine is developed to combat that year's particular influenza virus, so annual immunization is necessary.
- Wash your hands. Frequent hand washing keeps lots of germs out of our bodies, including the influenza virus. If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer.
- Stay home if you are sick. Should you become infected, keep the germs from spreading by staying home and taking care of yourself.

Immunize El Paso has two clinics. The downtown clinic is at 222 S. Campbell in the basement (phone: 533-3414) and the eastside clinic is at 1580 George Dieter, Ste. 102 (phone: 857-2474). Both clinics are open Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to noon and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. The eastside clinic is also open the third Saturday of each month from 9 a.m. to noon.

Music festival scheduled in La Union cornfield

La Union, NM - Maldonado Farm's Corn Maze, located near La Union, NM (about five miles from Canutillo, TX), will be the site of El Paso area's first Labyrinth Corn Maze Music Festival.

The farm, which is over 19 acres of corn fields and seven acres of parking space, lies west of the Upper Valley's 400 year-old Don Juan de Onate Trail in New Mexico, also known as Highway 28.

The festival is scheduled to start at 4 p.m. and continue to 2 a.m., Friday, October 26, and from 10 a.m. to midnight, Saturday, October 27. Food and beverage, as well as arts and crafts, vendors will also participate.

The musical event will feature over 20 bands and DJs from throughout the country. Promoting the El Paso's first-ever corn maze music festival is Jarrod Guaderrama of Boulder, CO. He said that a wide variety of musicians are scheduled to perform, from Technicolor Tone Factory to Bumpstreet Fonanza to Quantum Cognition, among others.

Admission fee is \$12 for one day or \$20 for both days. To accommodate out of town visitors, the maze will offer overnight camping for RVs and tents during the event.

As part of the music festival, the farm will provide various attractions including a trip through the corn maze, farm animals' petting zoo, jumping balloon party, and a trek to the pumpkin patch.

Crime Stoppers

Officers respond to an aggravated assault call and upon arrival find a man critically injured by stab wounds, who died a short time later, making this the Crime Stoppers "Crime of the Week." Just before 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 16, 2012, officers from the Police Department's Northeast Regional Command were called to the 11000 block of Rockdale in reference to an aggravated assault that had just occurred. When they arrived, a witness told them that the victim had asked for help and then walked into a garage and closed the door. When officers entered the home they found the victim face down with stab wounds. He was rushed to a hospital but died a short time later. The victim was 30-year-old Lucostal Leon Holley. Investigators from the Crimes Against Persons unit determined that the victim was seen talking to two men in front of a nearby home. All three were later seen near the home where the victim was found, with the two suspects holding the victim against a fence. They are described only as heavyset black men. If you have any information at all about the identity of the suspects in this case, please contact Crime Stoppers of El Paso at 566-TIPS (566-8477), on-line at www.crimestoppersofelpaso.org or you can send a text message by entering the key word CRIME1 (no space) plus your tip information, and text it to CRIMES (274637). Pacific theater for the duration of the war, he related.

In 1947, the aircraft was removed from storage in Japan and assigned to Clark Field in Manila as a photomapping plane. She served in that capacity for nearly three years, flying to all corners of the Pacific.

According to Stemple, Sentimental Journey was eventually transferred to Eglin Field, Florida, and was used as an air-sea rescue craft serving with the 3215th Drone Squadron at Patrick Air Force Base in Florida. During this time, it participated in the postwar atmospheric nuclear weapon tests conducted by the United States as a mother ship for the nuclear testing in 1951.

On January 27, 1959, military orders transferred the airplane to storage at Davis Monthan Air Force Base in Tucson, Arizona. Within a few months, however, the plane was acquired by Aero Union Corporation of Chico, California and became a civilian aircraft for the next 18 years.

Stemple said that in 1978, the

newly formed CAF Arizona Wing received the aircraft as a donation. The Arizona Wing members immediately undertook the tasks of cleaning, polishing, repainting, and honing the ship into excellent condition and initiated extensive crew training for flying the refurbished bomber.

By 1986 Sentimental Journey was making an average of 60 appearances annually throughout the United States and Canada. Now, about 80,000 persons tour through Sentimental Journey every year.

After the annual air show schedule is completed in the fall, Sentimental Journey returns to Falcon Field in Mesa, Arizona, to undergo general repairs and restoration work. Everything from engine changes to aircraft repainting has to be performed before the next air show season starts in May.

CAF has over 160 aircraft with two-thirds of them flying and the other third being restored to flying status. CAF consists of more than 9,000 volunteer members in more than seventy branches throughout the country. These branches, or wings, are homes to magnificent museums that house historic aircrafts and



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



The brains of those with cells are lost. With microscopic examination of an Alzheimer's brain, deposits of amyloid, a protein material, are seen. They look like lumps of lava from a volcano, and they presumably kill off brain cells and block communication between them. Tangles of another protein called tau also are scattered through the brain. What leads to the formation of these proteins is as yet unknown.


