### Best driving states

With U.S. traffic congestion costing U.S. drivers \$87 billion in 2018 and the U.S. ranked 17th in the world in road quality, the personal-finance website WalletHub has released its report on *2020's Best & Worst States to Drive* in as well as accompanying videos. To determine the most driver-friendly states in the U.S., WalletHub compared the 50 states across 31 key metrics. The data set ranges from average gas prices to share of rush-hour traffic congestion to road quality. Texas was rated 4th in the report. Driving in Texas (1-Best; 25-Average):

## Young men required to register for selective service

**NATION** – In the United States, men between the ages of 18 and 25 are legally required to register for the selective service, that is for possible draft purposes. This stark reminder came to light recently when talk of a confrontation with Iran resurfaced in Washington D.C.

Presently, there is no active draft, and it would take an act of Congress signed into law by the president for the Selective Service Administration to go back in action and call people involuntarily to military service, according to U.S. military professionals.

For now, the selective service system is simply a database for the government to keep a list of eligible males whom they can draft to serve in the military should there be a need, one military expert explained. “Enacting a draft is a congressional power, not a presidential

one. Should there be a need for people to serve in the military involuntarily, then that list would be used to start calling people to service,” he stated.

As it stands currently, by law the government requires only that men register, and the government would need to enact new legislation to actually put men in arms. A draft is meant to be activated only in an extreme emergency, like a full-scale war with a formidable foe.

Most 18- to 25-year-old men are automatically registered in most states, like Texas, when they obtain their driver's licenses, submit paperwork for college financial aid, or apply for a federal government job.

The law stipulates that males have up until 30 days after they turn 18 to register, but there is a grace period that allows them to register up until the last day of their 25th year. Even permanent residents, regardless of citizenship status, are expected to register for the selective service. Only men who are not between

the ages of 18 and 26 are exempt from selective service.

Failing to register may lead to fines, possible imprisonment, and not being eligible for certain benefits, according to selective service officials. Although rarely has an individual been fined or thrown in jail for not registering, the main thing he should worry about is that he would be limited in his financial resources and future career choices, officials pointed out.

“It will cut them out of the market for student loans and make it harder, if not impossible, to get a job with the federal government or apply for an internship,” one official stated. “It is a more moderate system of penalties rather than a criminal procedure,” he added.

But just because a man registered, it does not mean that he will automatically have to serve in the military if a draft is reinstated. “If a person has a physical

## Social Security chief warns of predatory phone scams

**NATION** – The Social Security Administration launched a new Public Service Announcement (PSA) campaign to continue warning people about the ongoing nationwide telephone impersonation scheme. The PSAs

feature a message from Social Security Commissioner Andrew Saul. Social Security and its Office of the Inspector General (OIG) continue to receive reports about fraudulent phone calls from people falsely claiming to be Social Security employees. The scammers mislead victims into making cash or gift card payments for help with purported identity theft, or to avoid arrest for bogus Social

Security number problems.

“I want every American to know that if a suspicious caller states there is a problem with their Social Security number or account, they should hang up and never give the caller money or personal information. People should then go online to [oig.ssa.gov](http://oig.ssa.gov) to report the scam call to



# Election too important to be left to the voters

The Democrats believe that the 2020 election is too important to be left to the voters.

It's obvious that President Donald Trump withheld defense aid to Ukraine to pressure its president to commit to the investigations that he wanted, an improper use of his power that should rightly be the focus of congressional investigation and hearings.

Where the Democrats have gotten tangled up is trying to find a justification that supports the enormous weight of impeaching and removing a president for the first time in our history.

They've cycled through different arguments. First, Trump's offense was said to be a quid pro quo, a phrase cast aside for supposedly being too Latin for the public to understand; then it was bribery, which has lost ground lately, presumably because of the inherent implausibility of the charge; now, the emphasis is on Trump's invitation to the Ukrainians to "meddle" and "interfere" in our elections.

This is posited to be an ongoing threat. Nancy Pelosi said in her statement calling on the House to draft articles of impeachment: "Our democracy is what is at stake. The president leaves us no choice but to act because he is

trying to corrupt, once again, the election for his own benefit."

House Judiciary Committee Chairman Jerry Nadler said on "Meet the Press" that Trump has to be impeached "for posing the considerable risk that he poses to the next election." Asked if he thinks the 2020 election will be on the up and up, he said: "I don't know. The president, based on his past performance, will do everything he can to make it not a fair election."


The gravamen of this case is that the election is too crucial to allow the incumbent president of the United States, who is leading in key battleground states and has some significant chance of winning, to run. In fact, the integrity of the election is so at risk that the U.S. Senate should keep the public from rendering a judgment on Donald Trump's first term, or deciding between him and, say, his nemesis Joe Biden.

Of course, it's possible to imagine a circumstance where a president would indeed present such a grave risk to our elections that he'd have to be removed. This is a reason that we have the impeachment process in the first place. But what's the real harm that Trump's foolhardy Ukraine adventure presented?

The bottom line is that after tsk-tsking Trump for refusing to say in advance that he'd accept the outcome of the 2016 election, Democrats have steadfastly refused to truly accept the 2016 result (allegedly the work of the Russians) and now are signaling they won't accept next year's election either, should they lose again. Given their druthers, Trump


wouldn't be an option for the voters. They are rushing their impeachment, in part, because they know that as November 2020 approaches, it becomes steadily less tenable to portray the man who wants to run in an election as the threat to democracy and the people who want to stop him as its champions.

With every day that passes, the Democrats risk creating the



perception that they themselves are a threat to the 2020 election.



Social Security,” said Saul.

People should also be on the lookout for a new version of this scam. Fraudsters are now emailing fake documents in attempts to get people to comply with their demands. Victims have received emails with attached letters and reports that appear to be from Social Security or the OIG. The letters may use official letterhead and government jargon to convince victims they are legitimate; they may also contain misspellings and grammar mistakes.

The new PSA addressing the

telephone impersonation scheme is available online at [www.youtube.com/socialsecurity](http://www.youtube.com/socialsecurity) and below:

Social Security employees do occasionally contact people--generally those who have ongoing business with the agency--by telephone for business purposes. However, Social Security employees will never threaten a person, or promise a Social Security benefit approval, or increase, in exchange for information or money. In those cases, the call is fraudulent and people should just hang up.

Generally, the agency mainly calls people who have recently applied for a Social Security benefit, someone who is already

receiving payments and requires an update to their record, or a person who has requested a phone call from the agency. If a person is not in one of these situations, they normally would not receive a call from the agency.

Social Security will not:

- Tell you that your Social Security number has been suspended.
- Contact you to demand an immediate payment.
- Ask you for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Require a specific means of debt repayment, like a prepaid debit card, a retail gift card, or cash.
- Demand that you pay a Social Security debt without the

ability to appeal the amount you owe.

- Promise a Social Security benefit approval, or increase, in exchange for information or money.

If there is a problem with a person's Social Security number or record, in most cases Social Security will mail a letter. If a person needs to submit payments to Social Security, the agency will send a letter with instructions and payment options. People should never provide information or payment over the phone or Internet unless they are certain of who is receiving it.

• On Jan. 27, 1943, future President Ronald Reagan, an Army Air Corps first lieutenant during World War II, is on assignment with the Army's First Motion Picture Unit. He had been tapped to star in a motion picture called "Air Force."

• On Jan. 28, 1964, the U.S. State Department angrily accuses the Soviet Union of shooting down an American jet that strayed into East German airspace, killing three U.S. officers aboard the plane. The Soviets said the flight was a "gross provocation."

• On Jan. 29, 1977, "Roots," a groundbreaking television program, premieres on ABC. The eight-episode miniseries, which aired on consecutive nights, follows a family from West Africa through generations of slavery and the end of the Civil War.

• On Jan. 30, 1933, Adolf Hitler, leader of the National Socialist German Workers Party (or Nazi Party), is named chancellor (Fuehrer) of Germany. Hitler immediately ordered a rapid expansion of the state police, the Gestapo.

• On Jan. 31, 1606, at Westminster in London, Guy Fawkes, a conspirator in the plot to blow up the British Parliament building, jumps to his death before his execution for treason. On Nov. 5, 1605, Fawkes had been found lurking in a cellar of Parliament with two tons of gunpowder.

• On Feb. 1, 1781, the Articles of Confederation are finally ratified. The Articles had been signed by Congress and sent to the individual states on Nov. 15, 1777, but bickering between Virginia and Maryland delayed final ratification for almost four years.

• On Feb. 2, 1887, Groundhog Day, featuring a rodent meteorologist, is celebrated for the first time at Gobbler's Knob in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. According to tradition, if a groundhog comes out of its hole on this day and sees its shadow, it gets scared and runs back into its burrow, predicting six more weeks of winter weather.

or mental condition that keeps him from serving, that will be decided after he is drafted," selective service officials noted. The same goes for people who are dual nationals. For instances, if the government decides that it does not want to draft men of a certain nationality, the selective service administrators would determine that after these men are drafted.

Also, transgender people

are prohibited from openly serving in the U.S. military, but trans women are still required to register for the draft because they were originally identified as a male at birth, according to the current law. "If a trans woman is drafted, she would appear for the medical examination and would likely not be inducted into military service," a military expert asserted.

The last men to be drafted were those drafted in December 1972 for the Vietnam War. The current version of the draft was also used during World War

I, World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War. It was also active in peace times between the latter two wars.

Once a male turns 26 years of age, he is exempt from being drafted. However, there is a past precedent for extending that age, according to military historians. They cited that in August 1918, during World War I, the age limit was amended to 45.

Additionally, just because a man is drafted, it does not mean that he

# Doctors disagree on blood pressure target

*DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a 91-year-old male. When I switched primary care physicians, my new doctor shook his head because my previous doctor had never told me about my low GFR readings and being borderline diabetic. In the past I had assumed that if the doctor didn't mention any low or high blood test results, everything must be OK. I no longer assume: I ask for a copy of the results and question them. The new doctor referred me to a nephrologist. My blood pressure at the time was usually in the 130-140/60-70 range. He told me that for a person of my age, that was too low. He gave me a target of 159/89. Then on my next visit to primary care, I was told that my blood pressure was too high; I was prescribed losartan. I am testing my blood pressure daily, and the past few days it has been in the 170s. So, what is a good target for my blood pressure? Which doctor is correct? - A.L.*



There is no absolute right answer to your question. On the one hand, overaggressive treatment of blood pressure in a 91-year-old is unnecessary and may lead to symptoms of lightheadedness, especially upon standing. Other blood pressure drugs may have additional side effects.

On the other hand, a 91-year-old has a higher risk for heart disease and stroke, and in someone with a low GFR reading (a measurement of kidney function) and borderline diabetes (which further increases the risk of heart attack and stroke), most experts would aim for a blood pressure goal that is closer to 120-130/80-85, as long as it isn't causing annoying symptoms. I'm not clear why the doctor wasn't happy with your usual blood pressure, since a level of 130-140/60s seems very reasonable for a man your age if you aren't having side effects. If 170 is the usual systolic pressure on your new regimen, I would ask about going back to the old one.

*DEAR DR. ROACH: I always have had small breasts. Suddenly, in my mid-70s, my breasts grew, and now at 80 I have outgrown most of my clothes. My doctor said that it is fat, but I have gained only a few pounds. Could this be hormonal? Have you addressed this issue before? - S.F.*

I haven't addressed this before. Breasts change size during a woman's life for many reasons. Breast tissue is a mixture of fat and glandular tissue. For young women, there's proportionally more glandular tissue, the amount of which tends to decrease over time. After menopause, the breasts become less glandular; what is lost is replaced by fat, as there is less estrogen.

About 20% of women will notice significantly larger breasts after menopause; however, this usually occurs along with overall weight gain. Significant breast enlargement without much weight gain is not common in my experience.

Hopefully, your doctor did a thorough examination. However, I think it is very unlikely that your breast size changes represent a tumor. Very rarely, there are estrogen-producing tumors, so if there were other reasons to be concerned, your doctor might check blood levels of hormones, including estrogen.

will be immediately thrown onto the front lines of the battlefield. "After someone is drafted, he can claim conscientious objector status, which is basically stating that he has religious or moral convictions that do not allow him to serve in war," commented a military expert. He added that in previous wars, claiming conscientious objector status allowed a person to serve as a medic or in other non-combat positions, and in extreme cases have made it so he did not have to serve in the military at all. Today, women cannot be drafted since the law does not require women to register for selective service. That could

change in the near future, as more women are now joining the military ranks in different capacities.

Victor Espinoza, a 22-year-old El Pasoan, said that he registered when he turned 18 because the requirement was clearly promoted in high school. "I don't have a problem with having to register for selective service and if a draft were to be implemented, I would join the military," he said.

Roman Loya, a Coronado High School senior who turned 18 in December, said that he found out about having to register for selective service when he was filling out college financial aid applications. "I just hope that the U.S. doesn't get involved in any kind of war that would make it necessary to start the draft again," he commented.

# Agent Orange benefits for Blue Water vets

As of Jan. 1, 2020, the Department of Veterans Affairs has extended presumption of Agent Orange herbicide exposure benefits with the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2019. That means it is now taking disability claims with the presumption that veterans were exposed to Agent Orange while offshore, not necessarily on the land or the inland waterways.

Here are some particulars: It covers 12 nautical miles off the coast of Vietnam from Jan. 6, 1962 to May 7, 1975 and between Jan. 1, 1967 and Aug. 31, 1971 in the Korean Demilitarized Zone. Additionally, verified service in Thailand at a certain time is covered.

There are 14 medical conditions that are covered for presumption of exposure to Agent Orange: AL amyloidosis, chronic B-cell leukemias,

chloracne, Type 2 diabetes mellitus, Hodgkin's disease, ischemic heart disease, multiple myeloma, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, Parkinson's disease, peripheral neuropathy, early-onset porphyria cutanea tarda, prostate cancer, respiratory cancers and soft tissue sarcomas.

Veterans who were there do not have to prove they were exposed; it's assumed they were. The VA has assembled tons of records. For example, see va.gov (put "blue water navy" in the search box) for lists of ships (updated October 2019). Scroll down the ships page to see various ways of herbicide exposure, such as supply trips, picking up Bob Hope, salvage operations, mapping surveys, mail runs, liberty leave ashore and more. The list is nearly 40 pages long.

To file an initial claim, you'll need VA Form 21-526EZ, Application for Disability Compensation and Related Compensation Benefits. If you filed and were turned down, use VA Form 20-0995, Decision Review Request:

Supplemental Claim. Because of the new law, the VA will automatically review claims in the pipeline or under appeal. Payment is retroactive to when you first filed.


