Crystal Shield

Attorney General William P. Barr and Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) Acting Administrator Timothy J. Shea announced the results of Operation Crystal Shield, the DEA's six-month-long effort targeting the command and control elements of Mexican cartels that operate major methamphetamine "transportation hubs" in the United States. Operation Crystal Shield generated a total of more than 750 investigations, resulting in nearly 1,840 arrests and the seizure of more than 28,560 pounds of methamphetamine, \$43.3 million in drug proceeds, and 284 firearms. In the DEA El Paso Division alone, which covers West Texas and New Mexico, the DEA conducted 101 investigations, made 176 arrests, and seized 919 pounds of methamphetamine, \$1,165,777 in drug proceeds, and 19 firearms. "In the months leading up to the launch of Operation Crystal Shield, communities across the United States experienced a surge of methamphetamine," said Acting Administrator Timothy J. Shea. "The COVID pandemic locked down many communities and impacted legitimate businesses, but the drug trade continued." The DEA launched Operation Crystal Shield on February 20, after identifying nine major methamphetamine trafficking hubs: Atlanta, Dallas, El Paso, Houston, Los Angeles, New Orleans, Phoenix, San Diego and St. Louis. Together these nine cities accounted for more than 75 percent of methamphetamine seized by DEA in 2019.

Vaccinated states

With multiple companies racing to develop an effective COVID-19 vaccine but 1 in 3 Americans saying they wouldn't get vaccinated, the personal-finance website WalletHub has released its report on 2020's States that Vaccinate the Most, as well as accompanying videos. In order to find out which states vaccinate most, WalletHub analyzed the 50 states and the District of Columbia across 18 key metrics, ranging from share of vaccinated children to share of people without health insurance to flu vaccination rate among adults. Texas ranked 48th in this report, ranking (1-Best; 25-Avg.):

Chihuahuan Desert Fiesta goes virtual

EL PASO COUNTY - This year's Chihuahuan Desert Fiesta, which is slated for Saturday, September 19, is going to be quite different than the previous fifteen other annual celebrations. have been able to incorporate social media platforms and Due to a surge in COVID-19 infections, fiesta planners have decided to offer a virtual fiesta as a precaution for the health and safety of the borderland communities.

"The main goal of the event that was held 15 years in a row at Franklin Mountains State Park, has been to encourage people to connect with and appreciate the Chihuahuan Desert," stated Rick LoBello, one of the fiesta's organizers. "This year's 16th annual fiesta on Saturday, September 19th will be no different in offering a variety of virtual educational experiences that highlight the flora and fauna of the Chihuahuan Desert, the largest and least known desert region in North America," he said.

Chihuhuan Desert Fiesta enthusiasts are being asked to save the date and to visit chihuahuandesert.org for the events schedule that is posted on the website.

Presentations this year will include a virtual tour of the El Paso Zoo's new Chihuahuan Desert Exhibit; two different opportunities to learn more about current efforts to save critically endangered Mexican wolves including an effort to return the wolf to Texas; and presentations with live animals from the Chihuahuan Desert that are living at the local zoo.

Also, among the fiesta virtual offerings will be a special presentation by Pam Agullo, Mrs. Texas Earth 2020, on the impact of people on the environment and wildlife. As Mrs. Texas Earth 2020, a pageant she won in April, Agullo stated on her website that she is committed to bringing awareness to and the desert's vast terrain.

For the past three years, Agullo has worked with the El Paso Zoological Society and serves on its board of directors. The 501c (3) non-profit group is governed by a volunteer board that is supported by local donors.

CANUTILLO – One of the top teachers in Texas is an educator in Canutillo ISD.



Moments in time THE HISTORY CHANNEL

- On Sept. 14, 1814, Francis Scott Key pens a poem that is later set to music and in 1931 becomes America's national anthem, "The Star-Spangled Banner." poem was written after Key witnessed Fort McHenry being bombarded by the British during the War of 1812.
- On Sept. 15, 1954, the famous picture of Marilyn Monroe, laughing as her skirt is blown up by the blast from a subway vent, is shot. The scene infuriated her husband, Joe DiMaggio.
- On Sept. 16, 1893, the largest land run in history begins with more than 100,000 people pouring into the Cherokee Strip of Oklahoma to claim valuable land. Towns like Norman and Oklahoma City sprung up almost overnight.
- On Sept. 17, 1787, the Constitution of the United States is signed by 38 of 41 delegates present at the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia. It would not become binding until it was ratified by nine of the 13 states. Nine months later, New Hampshire became the ninth state to ratify the document.
- On Sept. 18, 1793, George Washington lays the cornerstone to the United States Capitol building. It would take nearly a century to complete, as architects came and went, the British set fire to it and it was called into use during the Civil War.
- 1969, On Sept. 19, President Richard Nixon announces the cancellation of the draft calls for November and December. He reduced the call-up by 50,000 men as part of his program of turning the war over to the South Vietnamese.
- On Sept. 20, 1973, in a highly publicized "Battle of the Sexes" tennis match, top women's player Billie Jean King, 29, beats Bobby Riggs, 55, a former No. 1 ranked men's player. Riggs had boasted that women were inferior, and that even at his age he could beat any female player. King beat Riggs 6-4, 6-3, 6-3.

Credit paydown

With the economy showing signs of life despite the ongoing impact of the coronavirus pandemic, WalletHub's new Credit Card Debt Study revealed that U.S. consumers paid down \$118 billion in credit card debt during the first half of 2020 – an all-time record. This record reduction in credit card debt has been driven largely by generous unemployment benefits and household austerity measures stemming from the pandemic, and the result gives us at least a bit of a silver lining to point to from 2020. WalletHub now projects that U.S. consumers will end the year with a slight reduction in credit card debt for the first time since the end of the Great Recession in 2009. Not all areas of the country will fare as well as others, however, judging from the most recent data. WalletHub compared how credit card debt levels changed across all states during Q2, and you can see the best and worst finishers below. Texas was rated 2nd in the report, behind only California. The average household in Texas owes \$9,343 in credit card debt, following a \$550 Q2 decrease. U.S. consumers paid down \$58.1 billion in credit card debt during Q2 2020 – a record for the second quarter of a year. That followed a record first-quarter paydown of \$60 billion.

The budget is set at \$3,924,805.00 and will help first responders in El Paso County ESD #1 protect property and lives in the communities they serve. ESDs are a political subdivision of the state of Texas similar to a school district or hospital district. Each ESD provides fire protection and emergency medical response in its local community.

"El Paso County Emergency Services District #1 is dedicated to the protection and preservation of property and life within our community," said Chief Kris Menendez. We are confident the brave men and women that serve as first responders will continue to have what they need to fulfill their mission."

ESDs are on the cutting edge of fire and EMS response and provide emergency services while spending anywhere from one third to one half of what municipalities spend when providing services of similar scope. If a resident in the ESD needs fire or EMS services, it is the ESD/Horizon Fire Department who will be providing the service rather than the city, county or state.

Funding for ESDs is constitutionally limited to the collection of property taxes - capped at 10 cents per \$100. In turn, this money is invested locally in fire engines, and fire stations, as well as personnel.



Vitamin D deficit after gastric bypass

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a 72-year-old woman in fair health. I had strong bones until I had gastric bypass surgery. Within two years, I developed osteoporosis. In 2016 my parathyroid hormone level was found to be elevated. However, it has come down over the past year or two from 97.76 to 68.95 pg/mL. The endocrinologist now has me on 8,000 IU of vitamin D-3 per day. My calcium was 9.3

and ionized calcium was 5.0. Meanwhile, the rheumatologist treating my osteoporosis has prescribed Reclast infusions once per year. I just received my second one this month. This summer I broke a toe on my right foot with no known trauma. In October I sustained a stress fracture of my left heel bone, again without any known trauma. I am very worried



about what all this means to my future bone health. – L.M.J.

I suspect you had vitamin D deficiency due to the gastric bypass surgery, which prevents your body from absorbing it efficiently. Without vitamin D, your bones cannot take up calcium as effectively. The parathyroid hormone often will increase in this situation, and this is called "secondary hyperparathyroidism."

It's important to note that both your total and ionized calcium levels are normal. Ionized calcium is the active form - some calcium binds to albumin, a major protein in blood. In secondary hyperparathyroidism, the calcium is never high. A high calcium and high parathyroid level always means primary hyperparathyroidism, which almost always comes from a tumor of the parathyroid gland. Unfortunately, I have seen people whose doctors have confused this point and missed the diagnosis.

With replacement of your vitamin D (at a high-enough dose, you can absorb enough), the PTH level is settling back down to normal, and it would be expected that your bone strength would start going up as well. I would expect your endocrinologist or rheumatologist to follow your bone density through a DEXA scan.

The Reclast (zoledronic acid) is an intravenous bisphosphonate, and it slows down reabsorption of your bone. Between the higher vitamin D and the Reclast, your bones should get better and your risk of fracture will decrease, but it will take time.

DEAR DR. ROACH: In a recent column, you discussed the effect of ibuprofen on men with an enlarged prostate. I am a 78-year-old who runs 15-20 miles per week, with benign prostatic hyperplasia and who also has reduced urinary frequency with occasional use of Advil. As a runner, I have been reluctant to make it a daily regimen because I have read that inflammation is part of the body's response to tissue damage, which is crucial to the healing process and is important for muscle growth. When ibuprofen's anti-inflammatory effect reduces symptoms, does it affect the healing process also? Can you comment on the pros and cons for runners? -B.M.

High-dose ibuprofen was shown to inhibit muscle protein synthesis following weightlifting exercise. This led to a suspicion that it might impair the gains in muscle strength that are made with exercise. However, a Canadian study showed that moderate doses of ibuprofen (400 mg after exercise) did not impair muscle growth or gains in strength. Using ibuprofen for occasional muscle soreness or for the purpose of reducing prostate inflammation should not adversely affect your performance in running.




