Stressed state

With April being Stress Awareness Month and America's biggest stressors in 2021 being money problems and the COVID-19 pandemic, the personal-finance website WalletHub has released its report on 2021's Most & Least Stressed States, as well as accompanying videos. To determine the states with the highest stress levels, WalletHub compared the 50 states across 41 key metrics. The data set ranges from average hours worked per week to the personal bankruptcy rate to the share of adults getting adequate sleep. Texas was ranked the 10th most stressed state in the report. Stress levels in Texas (1-Most Stressed, 25-Avg.) according to the report were ranked:

- 4th Avgerage Hours Worked per Week;
- 8th Percent of Adults in Fair/Poor Health;
- 28th Job Security;
- 4th Median Credit Score;
- 30th Housing Affordability;
- 13th Percent of Population Living in Poverty;
- 25th Divorce Rate;
- 14th Crime Rate per Capita; and
- 19th Psychologists per Capita.

El Paso Community Foundation offers grants to area teachers

EL PASO COUNTY – El Paso Community Foundation's (EPCF) Classroom Fund is making available teaching grants to full-time teachers in the El Paso region. The resource grants are for the 2021-2022 school year.

The Classroom Fund, which was created in 2011 as a special foundation project, is designed to provide classroom materials directly to borderland educators who file

their requests before the deadline. This year, applications are due by Saturday, May 16.

EPCF was established in 1977 to foster philanthropy and provide a longterm endowment to address the unique opportunities and challenges of the El Paso, southern New Mexico, and Ciudad Juárez region, according to its website. Today, EPCF provides a wide range of philanthropic services in the region as a grant maker, convener, and leadership organization to the community.

Since its inception, EPCF has channeled more than \$230 million to various organizations. In 2020, the foundation awarded more than \$15 million to support different grants and projects.

The latest EPCF grant requests will be reviewed by a special Classroom Fund committee and will be approved based on merit and available funds, stated El Paso

Community Foundation officials, and that selected grantees would be notified by early June.

The classroom fund offers grants for \$1,000 or less to school personnel who show how the materials they are requesting will be used or experienced directly by students. Grants are available to full-time pre-K through 12th grade educators including teachers, librarians, guidance counselors, school nurses, and coaches who are also teachers.

"Eligible candidates must spend at least 75 percent of their time working directly with students," foundation officials pointed out.

As part of the grant guidelines, recipients are required to submit a summary report that demonstrates- through photographs, videos, or written lettersthe implementation of the materials that were procured with the foundation's grant funds.







• On March 29, 1973, the last U.S. combat troops leave South Vietnam as Hanoi frees the remaining American prisoners of war held in North Vietnam. America's direct eight-year intervention in the Vietnam War was at an end.







Deep vein thrombosis usually due to surgery

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a 47-year-old woman. Five years ago, I developed a blood clot in my left leg after fracturing my ankle and

being immobilized for several months. I was put on a blood thinner, and my ankle healed. Recently that leg started swelling again, and I went for an ultrasound. I was told that I have a chronic DVT, but that I don't need blood thinners. Why do I not need a blood thinner now when I did before? What does "chronic" mean? Why am I getting swelling again five years after the first clot? – L.S.B.



Blood clots can happen in veins or arteries, but the type that happen due to surgery and immobilization are almost always in the vein. That's the "V" in "DVT," which stands for "deep vein thrombosis."

A brand-new blood clot has a high risk of propagating further up the vein, and also of breaking off and traveling through the vein into the heart. Most often, the clot will go on into the lungs, then called a "pulmonary embolus." But in the rare case, the clot can go through a patent foramen ovale, which is sometimes called a hole in the heart, and cause a stroke.

Because of the risk of life-threatening complications, acute DVTs are treated with anticoagulants, such as warfarin (Coumadin) or apixaban (Eliquis). This stabilizes the clot, and after a week or two the risk of propagation or embolization becomes much lower. Most people are treated for at least three months for maximum benefit. Treatment does not dissolve the clot, and a follow-up ultrasound will detail changes that show the clot is no longer acute, hence "chronic." The vein itself is scarred and damaged, and never returns to normal.

"Chronic DVT" isn't the best term, since it confuses many, both patients and physicians alike. I prefer scarred, and some experts use "chronic luminal changes" to differentiate it from an acute clot. Whatever it is called, it may still be symptomatic.

Most people with a history of a large clot on one leg will notice that leg swells more than the other in heat or with a large salt load. Even so, anticoagulant treatment is neither necessary nor helpful.

Effective treatment for swelling associated with previous DVT includes salt restriction, compression stockings and leg elevation several times during the day. People with more severe symptoms that do not respond to conservative management may benefit from more aggressive therapies, such as placement of a metal stent to let the blood flow better through the damaged area.

DR. ROACH WRITES:

I am often asked about screening tests for pancreatic cancer. Despite the promise of new tests, the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force recently re-reviewed the available evidence and continues to recommend against screening in the general population. However, it's important to recognize that these recommendations do not apply to people at increased risk for pancreatic cancer, such as those with familial pancreatic cancer or with some genetic syndromes, such as Peutz-Jeghers syndrome. 



· Ficus trees can remove up to 80% formaldehyde in the air. Other great indoor air-cleaning plants include peace lilies, ivies, spider plants and ferns.


