#### Teen drivers

With teens obtaining driver's licenses during the summer more than any other season and an average of seven teens dying every day from motor vehicle injuries, the personal-finance website WalletHub has released its report on 2022's Best & Worst States for Teen Drivers, as well as accompanying videos and expert commentary. In order to determine the safest and least costly driving environments for U.S. teenagers, WalletHub compared the 50 states based on 23 key metrics. The data set ranges from the number of teen driver fatalities to the average cost of car repairs to the presence of impaired-driving laws. Texas was rated 16th in the report, ranking (1-Best; 25-Avg.):

- 32nd Teen Driver Fatalities per 100,000 Teens;
- 25th Teen DUIs per 100,000
- 38th Avg. Cost of Car Repairs;
- 1st Presence of Distracted-Driving/Texting-While-Driving Laws;
- 38th Premium Increase After Adding Teen Driver to Parent's Policy;
- 36th Provision of Teen Driver's Graduated Licensing Program Laws;
- 22nd Vehicle Miles Traveled per Capita;
- 7th Presence of Occupant-Protection Laws;
- 34th Quality of Roads; and
- 1st Presence of Impaired-Driving

### Commissioners consider upgrades to coliseum

EL PASO COUNTY - After listening to the results of a study that was recently completed, El Paso County Commissioners are mulling over a proposal to make coliseum, which is located in El Paso's south-central district.

Samaniego stated that he is interested in making improvements that capture the history of the revered building instead of trying to make it look modern. He stated that he saw this as an opportunity to differentiate the coliseum's unique offerings from other event venues in the music museum be part of the renovation plans as a way to showcase not only famous stars who have performed in the arena, but also local artists who have made names for themselves.

Included in the study that was presented at Ascarate Park. The county park's amphitheater proposed in the consultant's study would have 1,260 seats next to a spacious lawn that could accommodate another 4,300 persons.



### Keeping America locked down

are showing up in New Jersey shopping malls.

"So, there's been a nuclear attack," says a smiling commentator standing on a deserted street. "OK, what do we do?" she asks in a breezy tone. Three things: Get inside—fast. Stay inside. Stay tuned for official announcements and don't come out until they tell you it's safe. "OK, you've got this!"

Why now? Nuclear weapons have been around since the 1950s. Of course, one of the nuclear powers involved in Ukraine might set off a nuke, intentionally or by accident, despite the Biden Administration's lack of concern.

But it might not be necessary use a nuclear warhead to destroy America as a free and sovereign nation. The COVID lockdowns devastated a huge part of America's middle class. A second round to finish us off might not work because Americans might not be scared enough of monkeypox or a new COVID variant to comply.

Enter, a neutron bomb equivalent disguised as a PSA. In case you don't remember, the neutron bomb was designed to kill people while keeping the infrastructure relatively intact.

could save millions of lives<sup>2</sup> in the event of a nuclear attack. Most important, if you ever see a bright flash, drop and cover immediately. You need to be lying on the ground when the blast wave arrives a few seconds later, if possible under cover to protect you from flying debris anyone trained to use them. Existing meters are generally such as shattered glass.

There might be fallout later. If there is, you can see it. It looks like sand, ash, or grit. Its radioactivity decays rapidly, falling by 90 percent in the first 7 hours, and an additional 90 percent for each sevenfold increase in

A 90-second New York City Public Service time. Shelter might be needed, usually for a few days. Announcement is going viral. Posters with its advice But since Americans have long been terrorized by the false statement that there is no safe dose of radiation, they might think they need to lock down until they starve. In fact, at accumulated doses less than 200 rads, most people will have no symptoms. There could be delayed effects, but years later.

> One grain of truth in the PSA is that if you need shelter, it is best to go to a basement, if there is one, or to the middle of a building. Radiation protection is increased by distance from the source or by intervening mass.

> Once you are inside, what next? Will there be a radio, electricity, or a functioning cell phone tower? Where are the authorities that you are supposed to depend on, and what can they do?

Radiation, like viruses, is an invisible threat. But it can be easily measured. During the Cold War Era, a simple radiation detector was created by the U.S. Department of Energy. This detector can be built from materials found in the average kitchen, and instructions for it would have 3 – https://oism.org/nwss/ been published in newspapers around the country. Now those instructions are on the Internet<sup>3</sup> (search Kearny Fallout Meter).

Every fire truck in every town used to have radiation The PSA contains none of the critical knowledge that detectors capable of monitoring nuclear fallout. There were about 5 million of those, ready and calibrated. Now all those meters are gone along with the people who knew how to use them.

> Today's emergency manager may not have meters, or designed for Hazmat purposes. you happen to be outside when "it" happens somewhere, anywhere, you are to assume you are contaminated, bag your clothing, and take a shower. (Good luck finding one.) Then stay inside indefinitely.

Cold War civil defense experts emphasized the necessity of keeping America working - not huddled needlessly in a bunker. Panic, they said, would actually do more damage than the bomb itself by shutting down essential services – just as it did in World War II in London. Once people got over the fear and learned to cope with the bombing, it became far less effective.


NYC's response to the nuclear threat seems limited to this PSA. No preparation of shelters or radiation monitoring or essential public education. In this context, the PSA is like shouting "Fire!" in a crowded theater after turning out the lights on the exit signs.

It resembles the COVID pandemic, which instilled terror, while canceling information on prevention and early home treatment.



- On July 25, 1832, the first recorded railroad accident in U.S. history occurs when four people are thrown off a vacant car near Quincy, Massachusetts. The victims had been invited to view the process of transporting loads of stone when a cable on a vacant car snapped, throwing them off the train and over a 34-foot cliff.
- On July 26, 1931, a swarm of grasshoppers descends on crops throughout lowa, Nebraska and South Dakota, devastating millions of acres. The swarm was said to be so thick that it blocked out the sun and one could shovel the grasshoppers with a scoop. Cornstalks were eaten to the ground and fields left completely bare.
- On July 27, 1981, Adam John Walsh, age 6, is abducted from a mall in Hollywood, Florida, and later found murdered. Adam's father, John Walsh, became a leading victims rights activist and host of the long-running television show "America's Most Wanted."

# Cuff location matters for good BP reading

DEAR DR. ROACH: I have always read that when you are having your blood pressure taken, your arm should be elevated

above your heart. When mine is taken this way, it is normal, around 120/70. When I go to the doctor, my blood pressure is taken with my arm hanging at my side. I often get a much higher reading taken this way, say, 140/90. Is there a correct way to take it, and does it affect the reading? My doctor said the position doesn't matter and wants to prescribe medication. – U.P.



When taking the blood pressure, the goal is to approximate the blood pressure in the heart. That means that the blood pressure cuff should be at the level of the heart. If the blood pressure cuff is above the heart, then the blood pressure reading will be artificially low. If the blood pressure cuff is dangling below the level of the heart, the reading will be high.

For every 10 cm (about 4 inches) above the heart, the blood pressure will be about 7 mm of mercury too low. If I stretch out my arm as high as I can above my heart, I can get it about 30 cm higher than my heart, which would be enough to explain the difference between the 140/90 and 120/70 you have observed. However, for most people when sitting up straight, a properly placed cuff on the arm will approximate the same level as the heart. Although you are right that the position matters, it sounds like the doctor's office is taking the reading correctly.

I should also note that the feet should be resting on the floor, not dangling, which can artificially raise the blood pressure. The arm should be supported while taking the blood pressure. I recommend taking the blood pressure three times and using the average.

Given how important blood pressure is, correct technique is essential in order to properly recommend who should get blood pressure treatment. Evidence is increasing that a 24-hour home blood pressure device is more accurate at determining who might need medication, especially in suspected white coat hypertension, where the readings are artificially high just because a person is in the office (even if they don't feel nervous).

DEAR DR. ROACH: I was receiving testosterone injections for a diagnosed low testosterone level (96, with the normal 300-720). I received testosterone injections for many years, as directed by my doctor at that time. Ultimately, I changed doctors, and the new one prohibited the testosterone injections as "too dangerous to continue." I objected then, and I am about to object again, since my symptoms in the past year continue to point to low testosterone, in my mind. I have low energy level, low libido and erectile dysfunction. — M.J.

If a person with normal testosterone takes a large amount of extra testosterone, such as athletes looking for a performance boost, there are significant risks. Scientists used to worry that a similar issue would be the case if a person with low testosterone took a replacement dose to get him into the normal range, but the fears of testosterone replacement therapy have been proven largely unjustified.

Given your symptoms and your definite low level, experts would agree that you are a good candidate for long-term testosterone replacement therapy. The risks and benefits are not known with certainty, but the evidence so far suggests no serious risks and some potential benefits on heart health, even beyond improvement in symptoms. I would suggest a consultation with an expert on testosterone replacement, such as a urologist..




