#### Happy states

With 87% of Americans feeling "anxious" or "very anxious" about inflation, the personal-finance website WalletHub has released its report on 2022's Happiest States in America, as well as accompanying videos and expert commentary. To determine where Americans have the highest satisfaction with life, WalletHub compared the 50 states across 30 key indicators of happiness. The data set ranges from the depression rate and the share of adults feeling productive to income growth and the unemployment rate. Texas was rated 36th in the report. Other stats:

- Hawaii has the lowest share of adult depression, 12.90 percent, which is 2.1 times lower than in West Virginia, the state with the highest at 27.20 percent.
- New Jersey has the fewest suicides (per 100,000 residents), 7, which is 4.4 times fewer than in Wyoming, the state with the most at 31.
- Utah has the highest volunteer rate, 51.20 percent, which is two times higher than in New York, the state where the rate is the lowest at 25.00 percent.
- Utah has the lowest separation and divorce rate, 15.63 percent, which is 1.7 times lower than in Nevada, the state with the highest at 25.79 percent.

#### States in debt

With inflation putting pressure on people's budgets and raising concerns about a prolonged recession, U.S. consumers are once again adding new credit card debt by the billion, racking up \$67.1 billion during Q2 2022, according to WalletHub's latest Credit Card Debt Study. That is an all-time record for credit card debt added during the second quarter of a year, and WalletHub now projects that consumers will add a total of \$110 billion in debt during 2022. This new debt is also likely to become even more expensive soon, with the Federal Reserve expected to continue to raise its interest. WalletHub anticipates this will cost people with credit card debt an extra \$5.3 billion over the next 12 months. In addition, the rise in debt is

# In Ukraine, there's no substitute for hard power

ongoing Ukrainian counter-offensive, if successful, could reshape the war and the geopolitical contours of Europe.

It is a testament to Ukrainian pluck and staying power has put in the hands of the Ukrainians.

Soft power, the coinage of political scientist Joseph Nye for the ability of a country to get others to do what it wants without coercion, is important; hard power is absolutely indispensable.

This is easy to forget in a West that believes deeply in democratic ideals and moral example. Even if it is true, as optimists believe, that the arc of moral history bends toward justice, an armored division can smash and bend it back.

The history of the West is in part the history of arms races, in fortresses, cannons, ships, rifles, aircrafts and much else.


Empires have risen and fallen on the strength of military hardware. Cities have conquered or been destroyed. Armies have triumphed or dissolved.

After the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Volodymyr but, above all, to the advanced weapons that the West Zelenskyy had bucketfuls of soft power. He was the most admired man in the world. He spoke at the United Nations, to Congress and other national legislative bodies, and even at the Grammys. What did that get him? It helped solidify the good will of Western countries, which was essential. He constantly tried to leverage that sentiment, though, for the hardheaded priority of more weapons.

> Zelenskyy could still be admired in death, or in a Russian prison, or as an exile. Yet, if he wanted to continue to be admired as the leader of an independent country, he needed sheer firepower.

> Ukraine's cause hasn't gotten any more just or inspiring over the last couple of months; it's gotten better armed.

Ukraine couldn't win a straight-up artillery fight with the Russians, and in fact it was losing one in a



grinding war of attrition. A HIMARS, or high mobility artillery rocket system, versus artillery fight, though, is a different matter.

The Ukrainians have used these long-range, precision systems provided by the U.S. to hit Russian artillery parks, ammunition dumps and logistical hubs. The strikes have caused breakdowns in Russia's fuel and ammunition supplies as well as in the cohesion of its troops and command-and-control.

The Ukraine war has been a conflict of stark phases and strategic adjustments and re-adjustments. The

not uniform across the country, as some areas have bigger payment problems than others. With that in mind, WalletHub compared all the states based on how much residents owe to credit card companies - specifically, how those balances changed in Q2. Texas was rated 2nd in the report for increased debt.

#### **Credit Card Debt Study Key Stats:**

- **Texas Debt:** The average household in Texas owes \$8,681 in credit card debt, following a \$593 O2 increase.
- Record Q2 Increase. Credit card debt increased by almost \$67.1 billion during Q2 2022, an all-time record for the second quarter of the year.
- Bigger-Than-Normal Buildup. Consumers' Q2 2022 credit card debt increase was 3.5X bigger than the post-Great Recession average for a second quarter.
- Record Annual Projection. WalletHub projects that consumers will end the year with roughly \$110 billion more in credit card debt than they started with, which would be close to an annual record.

#### **Fed Rate Hike Survey Key Findings:**

- More Costly Debt. A Federal Reserve interest rate increase on September 21 would cost people with credit card debt an extra \$5.3 billion in the next year alone. That's on top of the \$15.3 billion increase already caused by the Fed's previous rate hikes this year.
- Inflation Concerns. 85% of Americans are concerned about inflation right now.
- Fed Increases Affecting Wallets. 63% of people say their wallets have been affected by the Fed's rate hikes this year.

- Monthly Expenses Affected. 62% of people say inflation has affected their monthly grocery expenses the most, followed by gas (32%) and housing (6%).
- Government Intervention at the Pump. 71% of people think the government should put a cap on gas prices.
- Not Recession-Ready. 44% of people do not think they are financially prepared for a recession.
- High Inflation Preferable to High **Unemployment.** 56% of Americans say they would prefer high inflation over high unemployment.



#### One big moth

The state of Washington's Department of Agriculture (WDA) is on a moth hunt but it's not your normal, pesky moths that eat holes in your favorite woolen sweater. This moth is the humongous, giant Atlas moth with a nearly 10inch wing span. Despite the fact that the Atlas moth has never before been seen in the U.S. and that it makes its home in tropical climates, one was spotted in Bellevue, WA recently. WDA entomologist Sven Spichiger is quoted in a department news release saying "This is a 'geewhiz' type of insect because it is so large. Even if you aren't on the lookout for insects, this is the type that people get their phones out and take a picture of – they are that striking." In fact, that's exactly what a University of Washington professor did when he found the behemoth of a moth clinging to the wall of his garage one day. He pulled out his phone and snapped away.



To be eligible for a Purple Star, schools must designate a campus-based military liaison, create and maintain an easily accessible web page that includes military-connected information for students and their families, institute a campus transition program for militaryconnected students, and support a military family assistance initiative.

Childress and Reyes have created special programming to help military families – especially those connected to Fort Bliss – cope with the challenges of transitioning into the local school system.

The program was created by the Texas Legislature in 2019. Winning schools will receive a Purple Star plaque to display on campus and will be recognized in a special announcement on the TEA website.

The Miners, who were averaging only about 2.5 yards per rush in their first four games, tallied 199 yards against a Boise defense that was ranked 12th in the nation coming into the game.

Another reason the Miners had struggled is because of the quarterback play of Gavin Hardison.

Hardison had spent most of this season throwing the ball 30 and 40 yards downfield whether they needed to gain 25 yards or just five.

# Multiple drug prescriptions

While using a different pharmacy to get see a doctor with a sub-par medical a much lower drug cost has one definite benefit, there is also a potential problem: A new pharmacist won't know you. If you only take one drug prescription to that new pharmacy, they won't know what other drugs you're taking. And therein can lie a serious outcome.

It's called polypharmacy, and it means that we're taking multiple prescription drugs. Technically, the definition means we're taking at least five medications, but it doesn't take five to potentially create a risk. Even taking four drugs comes with an increased risk of falls, for example.

There are several ways this situation can occur. We might be seeing more than one doctor for a condition and be given a prescription by one doctor and another by a different doctor with instruction to keep taking it until the next visit. We might be on a pharmacy auto-refill program that sends us drugs, which we dutifully take. We might

assistant who blithely renews all our prescriptions without asking. The software at the pharmacy's computer might not be updated or might not even be new enough to pick up drug contraindications and flash an alert on the screen.

We need to take charge!

When you go for a doctor visit, take all your drugs with you in a bag, including any vitamins and over-thecounter drugs you picked up along the way. Line them up on the desk and ask the doctor (not a nurse) to verify that you should be taking all of them.

Remember that when a health care provider treats you, it's part of their job. At the end of the day, they go home. And at the end of the day, you live with the results of what they either do or don't do.



# Size of aneurysm determines whether surgery is necessary

DEAR DR. ROACH: My husband will be 83 in September and was recently diagnosed with an ascending thoracic aortic aneurysm

measuring 4.8 cm. Five centimeters is when the doctors decide to do something. After hearing about the survival rate based on your recent column, along with your comment that "most people do not survive a rupture of the aorta," I'm scared. Why do they wait until 5.0 or rupture? His doctor says to test again in six months and to just keep his blood pressure



down. Shouldn't he be careful about strenuous activities until repair? We can only wait at this point, it seems. -C.G.

The aorta, the largest blood vessel in the body, comes directly off the heart, ascends to form an arch, and then descends through the chest into the abdomen. The aorta is then considered in three divisions: the ascending thoracic aorta; the descending thoracic aorta; and the abdominal aorta. Aneurysms can occur in each of these areas, and each has slightly different criteria for when to

In my most recent column, that was an abdominal aortic aneurysm. Most adults with an ascending TAA are recommended for surgical repair at a diameter of 5.5 cm. However, if the aneurysm is rapidly expanding, surgery may be considered earlier. If a person has a medical illness, making surgery very risky, surgeons may wait until the size exceeds 6 cm. The decision on when to operate requires judgement from an experienced surgeon and cardiologist. This is a major surgery with potential for harm, including death, and it's not to be undertaken unless the benefits clearly outweigh the risks. Rupture is unlikely at less than 6 cm.

Keeping the blood pressure down (below 120 systolic) is a good idea. Beta blockers are most commonly used for that, based on studies in people with genetic risk for TAA, such as Marfan syndrome. Statin drugs are often used, as there is evidence to suggest that they slow down expansion of the aneurysm.

#### From Dr. Daniel F. Hayes:

You recently wrote on the concerns of bisphosphonate drugs like alendronate (Fosamax) in people with osteoporosis. These drugs, especially intravenous zoledronic acid, have been game-changers in patients with breast and other cancers that spread to bone. They have dramatically reduced the incidence of dangerously high calcium in people with cancer and have substantially reduced bone fractures due to cancer. There is a considerable body of literature supporting their use as therapy to reduce recurrence, and even mortality, in selected patients with early stages of breast cancer.

When we first started using them [at the University of Michigan Rogel Cancer Center], we observed osteonecrosis of the jaw in about 10% of treated patients. We quickly realized we could reduce the risk by using them less frequently and by having our patients see dentists to ensure hygiene before we start. With these considerations, the incidence of osteonecrosis of the jaw with bisphosphonates (or denosumab) has dropped to less than 1%.

These medicines are very important for patients with cancers that have spread to bone, and we don't want people afraid of these very effective agents that are safe when used correctly. – D.H.


