### **Bullies**

With 20% of students ages 12-18 experience bullying, the personal-finance website WalletHub has released its report on 2023's States with the Biggest Bullying Problems, as well as expert commentary. To identify the states where bullying is most pervasive, WalletHub compared 47 states and the District of Columbia across 20 key metrics, ranging from the bullying-incident rate to truancy costs for schools to the share of high school students bullied online. "Atrisk children for bullying tend to be children who are unique in some way. This often means that the child is a different race, ethnicity, or sexual orientation than the majority of their peers, the child is differently abled, the child has a unique family composition, or the child is experiencing poverty," said Assistant Professor Rebekka Russell, MSW, LSW (Malone University) Texas was rated 17th in the report. Best vs. Worst:

• Delaware has the lowest share of high school students bullied on school property, 10.20 percent, which is 2.5 times lower than in Alaska, the highest at 25.50 percent.

• The District of Columbia has the lowest share of high school students bullied online, 8.90 percent, which is 2.4 times lower than in New Hampshire, the highest at 21.80 percent.

• Maine has the lowest share of high school students involved in a physical fight on school property, 3.20 percent, which is 4.6 times lower than in California, the highest at 14.70 percent.





As a first-year student at San Elizario High School (SEHS), Emiliano Ortiz is fourteen years of age; he knows the fight for his life to beat cancer has been the most critical me." spring break in his eighth-grade year at the Ann M. Garcia-Enriquez Middle School (GEMS). Emiliano went from being actively engaged in sports such as football, soccer, track, and wrestling to being unable to participate in any physical activity due to his delicate immune system. Emiliano's chemotherapy treatments for cancer would cause him to feel weak and lose weight; his appetite was impacted, and he often felt nauseous. With tears rolling down his cheeks, he vividly recalls, "I asked God to help him through the most challenging times.

He also thanks his GEMS peers for keeping his spirits high during this challenging period. On March 7, 2023, Emiliano went to bed with He states, "My friends kept in contact with me as we played video games online. They always encouraged me to stay positive and keep fighting." Emiliano concluded his chemotherapy a few weeks after he began his first year in high school and is being regularly monitored.

Emiliano is now a san Eli Eagle in high school. Remaining a student in San Elizario was important to Emiliano as his older siblings are all San Elizario alumni. 

On Oct. 16, 1968, American athletes Tommie Smith and John Carlos sparked controversy at the Mexico City Olympics by giving "Black power" salutes during a victory ceremony after they'd won gold and bronze medals in the 200 meter race.

On Oct. 17, 1933, Albert Einstein arrived in the United States as a refugee from Nazi Germany after renouncing his German citizenship. He had been barred from working at any universities in his homeland but would become a professor of theoretical physics at Princeton University.

On Oct. 18, 1648, in response to complaints of shoddy workmanship performed by some members of their trade, the Boston Company of Shoemakers was authorized to form a guild to set a guality standard and protect their interests, resulting in the creation of the first American labor organization on record.

On Oct. 19, 1990, Kevin Costner's Western epic Wolves" "Dances with had its world premiere in Washington, D.C. The actor put up \$3 million of his own money to complete the film and was made an honorary member of the Sioux Nation after its release.

On Oct. 20, 1990, a six-member jury in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, acquitted three members of the rap group 2 Live Crew of violating obscenity laws, stemming from their adults-only concert at a nightclub in nearby Hollywood the previous June. The prosecution's only evidence was two garbled tape recordings of the event made by undercover deputies.

On Oct. 21, 1805, a British fleet commanded by Admiral Horatio Nelson defeated a French-Spanish fleet in the Battle of Trafalgar. He was fatally felled by a bullet from an enemy sharpshooter that tore through his chest and lodged in his spine, Nelson lived long enough to follow the battle's progress and realize his own victory.

## **Public catches a view of Ring of Fire eclipse**

On October 14, 2023 El Paso Community College (EPCC) in collaboration with NASA's GLOBE Program, The University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP) Geology and Physics departments, CasaSola Museum and Tornillo Elementary hosted an annular solar eclipse viewing. The public was able to view the solar eclipse safely with filtered telescopes and solar glasses. EPCC participated with NASA in collecting valuable environmental data during the eclipse to help scientists learn more on how eclipses affect our environment. A guest speaker from the Instituto Nacional de Antropologia e Historia (INAH) from Mexico City was streamed, discussing how eclipses have impacted societies, especially in the western hemisphere. "We wanted people to enjoy the solar eclipse and learn about how this phenomenon affects our environment. The public was able to help NASA by collecting data during the event," John Olgin, EPCC Professor and NASA GLOBE member said.

The pharmacy was in the chain where I do business, but it was from the branch in the next town, not where my prescriptions are. And when I looked closely at the number in the link to click, I realized it was from an area code in a completely different state.

I put the phone down and got on the internet. Sure enough, that linked number was fake and was used in all manner of scams, including ones that could have instantly downloaded

malware onto my phone. I called the pharmacy in question (from my other phone) just to be sure they hadn't sent it. No, they hadn't. I very carefully deleted that scam message,


So all is well, but I'm a bit unnerved by just how close I The text message on my phone appeared to come from came to blithely clicking that link because I didn't initially question the message.

## **Turmeric can be helpful** for some arthritis pain

Why was fen-phen taken off the market? DEAR DR. ROACH: I'm a 71-year-old healthy female

who has struggled with my weight all my life. In the '90s, I thought I had finally found the solution in fenphen. It was like a miracle! It took all the nagging thoughts of food out of my brain. My question is, with all the drug ads on TV every day blithely showing the many side effects leading up to – and



including – death, why can't we use fen-phen? I worked in a hospital where a very large number of employees were taking it with great results. I never heard a hint about anything that could affect someone's health. Also, I talked to many of the other patients at the doctor's office where I was receiving it. Everyone was overjoyed with the results. I had no temptations and no constant yammering in my brain to eat something. As I said, it was a miracle. I felt like a normal person. So, why are all of these drug companies allowed to advertise their products, but one drug that truly worked had to get snatched away from us? - M.H.

Fen-phen was a combination of fenfluramine and phentermine, which was approved for use in 1986. Approximately 18 million prescriptions were written for this medicine until 1987, when an association was made between the use of fen-phen and valve diseases of the heart. These cases were reported with fenfluramine or with the related dexfenfluramine alone, but never with phentermine alone. (Phentermine remains on the market.) Approximately 150 cases were reported.

Subsequent studies estimated that seven out of 10,000 people who took fenfluramine or fen-phen for less than four months developed valve disease, while 35 in 10,000 people who took fenfluramine or fen-phen for more than four months developed valve disease. They were compared to people who either took phentermine alone or did not use a weight-loss medicine.

The U.S. Food and Drug Adminstration determined that the risk of valve disease (some being severe enough to prompt valve replacement surgery) was too high, so the FDA asked manufacturers to remove these drugs from the market.

I fully understand your perspective. Some people are willing to take the risk of a side effect because the benefit of the medicine is so great. In my opinion, people should have the option of making their own decision, but in this case, the FDA felt that the risk was too high.

I have not seen a medicine for weight loss as effective as fen-phen until recently, when semaglutide (Wegovy and Ozempic) and tirzepatide (Mounjaro, not yet approved for weight loss) became available. Just as you say, many of my patients report that they were able to easily control their eating while on these medicines, and as of the time I am writing, there have not been any serious adverse effects of taking these drugs, although there are plenty of milder effects. However, these medicines only work when you continue to take them, and stopping them generally results in rapid regain of the weight that was lost. It's important to realize that if you take a weight-loss drug, you're making a commitment to a long-term treatment.


