Credit scores

With a good credit score being essential for getting approved for loans and lines of credit, as well as securing low interest rates and high credit limits, the personalfinance website WalletHub has released its report on the Cities with the Highest & Lowest Credit Scores in 2024, as well as expert commentary. WalletHub's report aimed to find out where Americans demonstrate the most responsible behavior, and it ranked the cities using WalletHub's proprietary data on residents' credit scores. El Paso ranked 140th with an average credit score of 651 in the report.

"Having a good or excellent credit score opens up so many doors for you. Not only does it help you get approved for future loans and lines of credit, but it also reduces your interest rate and increases the amount you're able to borrow. A good credit score can even make you a stronger candidate for employment, help you with renting housing, and make you a more attractive dating partner. South Burlington, VT residents have the highest average credit score in the country, at 736. That puts them into the excellent credit range. Since South Burlington residents are so financially responsible, it's not surprising that they also have high incomes. The median income is around \$65,700, ranking 29th highest out of the 182 cities in our study."



If not, the deposit is used to repay the outstanding debt and the personal credit profile suffers."

"Prioritize to pay off your debt that has the highest level of interest, most likely credit cards, and if possible, consolidate your debt into a loan that you can solely focus on repaying. Try to avoid the 'new buy now, pay later' offers for purchases. These programs are just another form of

debt. As the debt gets paid off, the credit score should go up." – Tom Arnold, Ph.D.

What is the best way for a young person to build credit?

"Setting up auto-pay is always the priority. Building credit is a long journey. That is the reason why prioritizing and budgeting is essential. Consumers should know the 'nonexpenses, discretionary' such as mortgage, utilities, groceries, etc. Creating a budget also helps and improves consumer's ability and responsibility to use credit cards. The more detailed budget has been completed, the better picture that consumers can have. Consumers can precisely track their historical usage to notice if they spend too much money on something unimportant, such as autorenew membership, etc. Checking and verifying each transaction regularly is also helpful. Avoid mental accounting: Some consumers may consider applying for new credit cards to cover their overspending behavior or overcoming tough times. Monitoring credit cards regularly and responsibly is extremely important for both young and older people. If young people maintain their budget behavior, having high and stable credit scores for a lifetime would be much easier."

"Open a credit card account: Apply for a credit card, preferably one designed for individuals with limited credit history or a secured credit card. Use it responsibly by making small purchases and paying off the balance in full each month to avoid interest charges... Pay bills on time: Timely payment of bills, such as rent, utilities, and student loans, can also contribute to building a positive credit history. While these payments may not initially appear on your credit report, some credit scoring models consider alternative data, like rent payments, in their calculations. Keep credit utilization low: Try to keep your credit card balances low relative to your credit limit. Ideally, aim to use no more than 30% of your available credit at any given time. Monitor your credit report: Regularly review your credit report to ensure that all information is accurate."

What are some strategies for people who are facing financial difficulties to protect their credit scores?

"Do not accrue more debt, consolidate your existing debt at a reasonable rate of interest, and pay down that debt. Generally, this is really a matter of controlling spending rather than a lack of desire to pay down debt. In fact, if you control your spending and even better, spending, reduce your paying down debt and savings are the by-products of these actions."



employers. Instead, firms should work aggressively reallocate internal to resources, increase labor attraction and retention efforts, and, most importantly, increase labor productivity. When there limited resources, are and at this stage in the economic cycle, there is a limited resource called labor, firms need to be rational and identify the most and least profitable lines. Reallocating labor to more profitable portions of the business will help the firm remain competitive and capture market share while the economy is strong. Although human resource departments have likely made multiple changes to wages, benefits, and corporate culture, those changes are not likely enough in most cases. Firms must remember that the power dynamic of having excessive labor for a few positions, which has been the case for more than two decades, is not where the market is today. Corporate profits are at record highs, which indicates that there remains room to provide more incentives to workers. The most crucial competitive factor firms must focus on in 2024 is developing a plan to increase labor productivity. Given that the labor market is at or near full employment, those companies that can increase the output per existing worker will gain a larger market share and profit over their competitors."



Paso sports fans would utter the same words every year, "I can't wait for basketball season to start."

They would usually say that in the middle of football season, as the Miners would suffer through another disappointing season.

But in 2024, things have changed a bit.

Now, fans all over the Sun City have been heard saying one thing over and over, "I can't wait for football season to start."

Why would fans be so excited for and boring UTEP football season?

Maybe it's because they really believe the new three words being thrown around to describe the new football program, "fearless, fast and will be running plays every 12-13 physical."

That's how new football coach Scotty Walden describes the style of play his Miners will undertake this season.

Walden and his Miners took the Sun Bowl field for the first-time last week for spring drills. UTEP will hold 15 spring practice which will culminate in the Miners' Spring Game on April 20.

• Don't do banking on your phone or computer, even if you know what you're doing with those devices.



• If you're asked to call *72 followed by a different number, HANG UP. Do not dial *72. 



Barrett's esophagus leads to tough medical choices

DEAR DR. ROACH: I am a retired male over 65 and a former occasional cigar smoker. I quit 15 years ago after I

was diagnosed with Barrett's esophagus. I was also a former drinker and quit seven years ago. I regularly completed all the biopsies as required and took my proton-pump inhibitor (PPI) daily as instructed.

This year, I read an article about PPIs contributing to dementia and neuropathy, which I have. My primary



care physician suggested that I switch to over-the-counter H2 blockers as a safer approach. I developed an irregular heart rhythm and soaring blood pressure.

I was then diagnosed with atrial fibrillation (AFib). My stress test and echocardiogram are normal for my age. I am now on some heavy-duty beta blockers, blood thinners and a very expensive rhythm-control drug.

A book I recently read written by two top cardiologists stated that long-term use of PPIs is dangerous and can cause AFib, but a recent article published by the National Institute of Health states the opposite. I also read that an irritated esophagus stimulates the esophagus nerve and triggers AFib. I'm confused now.

Because Barrett's vastly increases my chances for getting a very aggressive cancer, doing nothing is not an option. I have already modified and continue to modify my diet, but that only goes so far. And as I'm sure you are aware of, a stroke caused by AFib is often life-threatening.

My complicated question is, which professional approach would you recommend: PPIs or H2 blockers? Is there a third option? -B.B.

There is not a definitive answer on whether PPIs, like omeprazole, increase the risk of AFib. Studies are potentially confounded by the fact that people with AFib sometimes think they have stomach problems and may take a PPI, leading to a false association between the PPI and AFib. As you say, there have also been studies that suggest a decreased risk of AFib in people who use PPIs.

In my mind, the increased risk of adenocarcinoma of the esophagus as a result of untreated stomach acid reflux in a person with Barrett's esophagus is the key in this situation, as Barrett's is a condition where abnormal lining of the esophagus occurs due to years of acid exposure.

I do not believe over-the-counter H2 blockers, like famotidine (Pepcid), are adequate enough to reduce the risk of esophageal cancer, so I advise patients in your situation to use PPIs, despite their known risks.

The data suggesting a risk of dementia are weak. While there might be a small risk, the risk isn't high enough to avoid using a PPI in a person with Barrett's. B12 deficiency is absolutely a risk in people taking long-term PPIs. Low B12 can certainly lead to neuropathy, but both can be prevented and treated by testing for B12 deficiency and by getting supplementation, if needed.




