Texas Gov. Rick Perry has proclaimed Thursday, April 27, 2006, as Bike and Walk to School Day in Texas. Students from around the state will celebrate this day by biking or walking to school, along with parents, teachers and community leaders. Schools in Texas' major metropolitan areas including El Paso have already signed up to participate. Children today have sedentary lifestyles. Statistics show an alarming increase in childhood obesity due to lack of exercise and poor diet. Texas' Agriculture Commissioner notes 38 percent of Texas fourth graders are overweight compared to 11 percent nationally. There is a critical need to shift children from cars, back to bikes and feet. Routine physical activity such as biking or walking to school combats child obesity and related health disorders. Clint district informs Horizon council on \$90 million bond issue

HORIZON CITY — With election-day steadily approaching, issues to be voted on are being addressed at different meetings. One of these is the \$90 million bond issue proposed by the Clint ISD.

Alfred Solis, Assistant Superintendent for Support Services, accompanied by some of his staff addressed the Horizon City Council regarding the bond issue at the regularly scheduled meeting on April 11.

Clint ISD encompasses about 379.9 square miles which includes three separate communities: the Town of Clint, Horizon City, and the Montana Vista Community in far East El Paso County.

Solis said there is tremendous growth in all these areas, especially the Horizon City area. Currently, the enrollment for Clint ISD stands at about 9050 students, a figure that is expected

to more than double within the next five years.

Currently, there are a total of twelve campuses. According to the presentation, the bond issue will allow each campus to receive upgrades. Some campuses will receive auxiliary gymnasiums since most elementary schools currently use the cafeteria as both a cafeteria and a gym. The tentatively plans to build a new elementary school and a new high school for the Clint area to replace the old Clint High School. Further details and a complete description of the needs being addressed with the \$90 million bond issue may be obtained by contacting Solis at 926-4000.

In other business, during Open Forum, the town's legal representative addressed City Council to announce that the issue with Emerald Springs Golf Course has been resolved. The golf course has been successfully sold to Friends of Emerald Springs and Bank of America has dropped its lawsuit against

Socorro ISD Police Officer is finalist for Hero of the Pass Award

EAST EL PASO COUNTY — Socorro ISD Police Officer Eddie Orozco, a School Resource Officer (SRO) assigned to KEYS Academy, was a finalist for the American Red Cross of El Paso's 2006 Heroes of the Pass Award.



Each year, the American Red Cross recognizes El Pasoans who have acted with extraordinary courage, compassion and unselfish character. Finalists in nine categories were honored at an awards luncheon April 5 at the Centennial Club. Orozco was a finalist in the Education Hero category.

"When I first heard that I was nominated for the Heroes of the Pass Award I could not believe it; a great feeling of accomplishment came over me," Orozco says. "But then I quickly realized I don't consider myself a Hero. It's a job and a task that I accepted over 20 years ago as a law enforcement officer. I'm a firm believer that saving every student is a dream, but to save one is a great accomplishment."

Socorro ISD Police Chief Michael Czerwinsky nominated Orozco for the Award because he is more than a "cop with a badge." Czerwinsky says an SRO must have exceptional people skills, good conflict resolution skills and good command presence.

"Officer Orozco strives to identify those students that can still be reached," the Chief says. "He wants to make them both good students and good citizens, to instill a sense of

City of El Paso receives grant to support Music Under the Stars

WASHINGTON D.C. — The National Endowment of the Arts (NEA) has awarded the City of El Paso a \$12,000 matching grant to support the Music Under the Stars concert series at the Chamizal National Memorial, according to an announcement from Congressman Silvestre Reyes.

"The Music Under the Stars program is anxiously awaited each year by the El Paso community," said Reyes. "It is important that the federal government support such a positive partnership between the City and the Chamizal that promotes the diverse music and culture of

the U.S.-Mexico border region," said Reyes.

City Manager Joyce Wilson thanked Congressman Reyes for his efforts on behalf of the City of El Paso and Museums and Cultural Affairs Department. She said it "helped to ensure the continued success of a summer favorite for the El Paso community and surrounding areas."

Music Under the Stars is a 22-year tradition in El Paso, and on average, over 90,000 people visit the Chamizal National Memorial to enjoy the festival each summer. Music Under the Stars provides families and friends with the

opportunity to gather and relax in the green space of the Chamizal, and listen to the sounds of jazz, salsa, Latin romantic, big band, swing, mariachi, oldies and Texas Swing.

Congress established the NEA in 1965 as an independent agency of the federal government dedicated to supporting excellence in the arts, promoting access to the arts, and providing leadership in arts education. The NEA's matching grants help support projects that involve the creation and presentation of artistically excellent work, and this grant is part of their second major round of fiscal year 2006 grants.

Border control: The first step to immigration reform

Congress last week considered granting amnesty for 12 million illegal immigrants in America. As they did so, the national debt stood at over \$8 trillion. The war on terrorism drew within seven months of its five-year anniversary. Programs like Social Security and Medicare continue to face grave uncertainties, long term and short. Education, housing, labor, commerce, agriculture and environmental protection are all pegged for reduced budgets in the next fiscal year. Undecided veterans benefits claims are stacked nearly a million deep, VA construction projects are delayed, and lines are once again forming at under-funded veterans' health-care facilities. In all, 141 federal programs are proposed for reduction or elimination in 2007.

The "guest-worker" program now being debated in Washington is a quick, costly stab at solving America's illegal immigration crisis. Recent history shows how the quick-fix approach won't work. In fact, it can be expected to quadruple the long-term federal cost of providing services for newly legalized immigrants, along with the dependents who will follow them in years to come. Their chances of realizing the American dream will be shot without a robust naturalization process that includes English language skills, allegiance to the laws of our nation, denouncement of our enemies, and an ultimate expectation of U.S. citizenship. Of course, deportation or incarceration of the millions who risked death to cross the border illegally — so many of them desperate to work hard and build better lives for their families — is logistically, economically and diplomatically unwise and inhumane. It is indeed a complicated problem, one that has ridden along like a stowaway in the cargo hold of our republic since its founding. The ultimate solution to illegal immigration may be years away.

In the meantime, there is one criti-

cal step America must take, particularly during this time of global war and threatened national security, a time when a nuclear device can be carried in a backpack. That step is a vastly stronger commitment to border control — on the south, the north, in our ports and every place else we have let our perimeters grow porous.

Border security, not amnesty, must be the first step. Without it, we can expect nothing less than a repeat per-

forming education to low-income children, fortifying the future of Social Security and, lest we forget, toward securing the borders and enforcing immigration laws already on the books in America.

Since the early 1920s, The American Legion has supported legal immigration, the naturalization process, the adoption of a shared language, and the lawful route to U.S. citizenship. That support is built on the hope

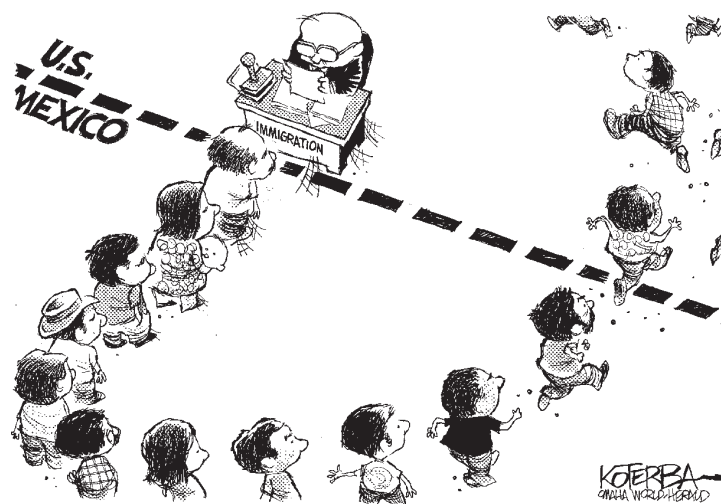
that future generations, regardless of their country of origin, have every opportunity to succeed and live out the American dream. The granting of amnesty eviscerates the process — rejecting laws built on the protection of the American people and of immigrants themselves. The granting of amnesty without an expectation of naturalization and

assimilation all but guarantees that newly legalized immigrants and their families will stay stuck at the bottom of the income and education ladder, caught behind a language barrier that is growing ever more impenetrable. Amnesty strips away any incentive for an immigrant to pursue citizenship the legal way, and it does nothing to untangle the red tape that prevents law-abiding immigrants from timely decisions on their visa applications.

The world possesses no nation so welcoming as America. But ours is not a house without rules, nor can it be, certainly not in a time of war. The answer to this dilemma resides somewhere between the deportation of 12 million illegal immigrants and the declaration that everyone in the world, regardless of their place of origin or intent, has a God-given right to live here. The answer has yet to come fully into focus, but we know from 1986 that putting a Band-Aid over a sucking chest wound is not going to heal our condition in the long run. And we can safely forecast from yesterday's experience that a blanket amnesty today will lead to a bigger one tomorrow.

In his final days, President Theodore Roosevelt grappled with the same problem and wrote the following: "We should insist that if the immigrant who comes here in good faith becomes an American and assimilates himself to us, he shall be treated on an exact equality with everyone else, for it is an outrage to discriminate against any such man because of creed, or birthplace, or origin. But this is predicated upon the person's becoming in every facet an American, and nothing but an American... There can be no divided allegiance here." His message, which captures the spirit of the naturalization process, is one our elected leaders would be wise to revisit as they work toward the resolution of our nation's most imposing issue.

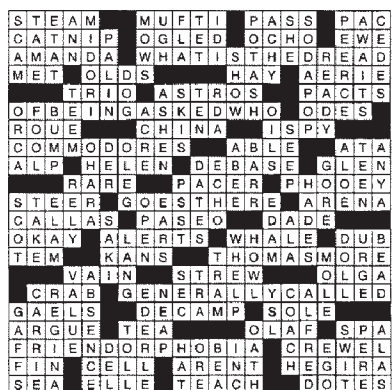

formance of the disastrous Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986. The act gave 2.8 million illegal immigrants a free pass from the laws they broke to get into America. Another 142,000 dependents soon followed. Ten years after the law was passed, the average immigrant who received amnesty in 1986 was earning \$9,000 a year and had made it only through the seventh grade. Meanwhile, the taxpayer cost of medicating, educating, feeding, incarcerating and providing services to that group alone is estimated at \$78 billion, according to the Center for Immigration Studies. Millions more illegal immigrants poured into the United States following the 1986 amnesty, which failed to make a necessary commitment to border control to go along with the free pass for those already living here.

In recent years, the brutal "coyote" industry of human trafficking has begun to eclipse narcotics smuggling along the border, leading hundreds to their deaths in the deserts or to be stuffed by the dozens into suburban drop houses with no place to go. Nearly 4 million are estimated to have immigrated illegally into the United States since 2000 alone.

If the 1986 model is applied to the guest-worker initiatives now debated in Congress, taxpayers can conservatively calculate \$312 billion to pay for this proposed amnesty over the next 20 years, at which time, without the necessary commitment to border control, another amnesty is certain to be proposed. The money will be spent, and the problem will still be with us. That \$312 billion would go a long way toward improving access to VA health care, provid-

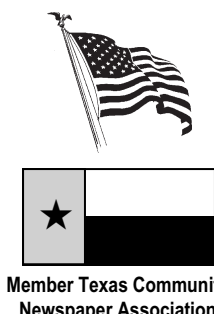

What matters more: Tax cuts for wealthiest Texans or truly educating our children?

Nothing is more important than educating our children so they can grow, prosper, and live the American dream. Since the days of Thomas Jefferson, America has valued great public schools where each and every one of us can reach our full potential.

In recent elections, people told lawmakers to meet the challenge and educate our children. When Texas ranks 48th in the nation on the SAT and 50th in high school graduation rates, our children's future is at risk. When 19 of the 30 El Paso area high schools fail to meet the progress standards in "No Child Left Behind" we must make educating our children the top priority.

Over the last seven failed sessions, some state leaders have pushed the "Great Texas Tax Shift," where they value tax cuts for wealthy donors over educating our children. For example, HB 3, the tax bill pushed by Republican leadership last year, would have raised taxes on any Texan making less than \$100,000 and cut taxes for those making six figures and

above. Here in El Paso, HB 3 would have resulted in a tax increase on 94 percent of the population.

More recently, Gov. Rick Perry's plan proposes to cut \$920 million of taxes on those who make more than \$104,000 and hike taxes by \$7 million on families making less than \$54,000 at a time when incomes of America's wealthiest have grown more dramatically than any era since the turn of the century. So those who make the most will pay the least.

Moreover, none of these bills raised any new money for certified and motivated teachers, smaller classes, or state of the art technology.

During past sessions, the majority balanced the budget by cutting 230,000 children out of CHIP instead of raising the tax on cigarettes. Right now, this same group wants to use the \$4.2 billion budget surplus to lower property taxes a few cents, end the special session, and get out of town. If we let them do that, then two years from now, lawmakers will face the same challenge in the schools, along with a \$4.2 billion deficit that

they helped create.

What's worse is that this tax system will never pay for certified teachers in math, reading, and science together with the small classes that we know truly improve schools. The fact is that Texas teachers now rank close to last in the country in pay, retirement, and health care, and Texas ranks 38th in the country in spending per pupil.

Republican leaders should do what we elected them to do: set aside their differences and lead us to a better future. For the first time in Texas history, Texas families face a less prosperous tomorrow if they do not put our children on a path to better education today. Let's create a fair tax system that Texans trust, where everyone pays a fair share. Cut property taxes substantially so more Texans can own homes. Raise the revenues we need to pay for good schools. And most importantly, remind them that they were elected to educate our children so that Texas can grow, prosper, and compete for 21st Century jobs.

Military medicine: Advancements saving lives, both military and civilian

Much of the medical technology that benefits Americans today in our day-to-day civilian life actually has roots in military medicine. This is not surprising given the challenges of military medicine coupled with the ingenuity of caregivers who come from, and return to, civilian medical practice.

The cure for yellow fever emerged from the Spanish-American War. The ground ambulance systems of today evolved from those developed during the Civil War. Field hospitals were located near the front lines, but a horse drawn carriage was needed to get the wounded to the makeshift facilities, distinguishable by a yellow flag marked with a green "H."

World War I was the first in which fatalities on the battlefield outnumbered deaths due to disease. This war brought us the cure for tetanus, the means to address severe shock, and the use of triage to prioritize medical care when faced with mass casualties. The introduction of antiseptic increased survival rates, and survivors benefited greatly from advances in prostheses and reconstructive surgery.

During World War II, we witnessed a dramatic increase in the effectiveness of weaponry. The sheer magnitude of the combat theater required as many men in uniform as possible to stop the Axis from advancing their invasion. The military concentrated on treating the wounded and returning them quickly to the battlefield. Medical innovations were created to meet this goal. Dr. Charles Drew was a leading authority on the processing and mass transfusion of blood. He discovered that plasma could replace whole blood, allowing for greater efficiency of transfu-

sions, saving thousands of lives.

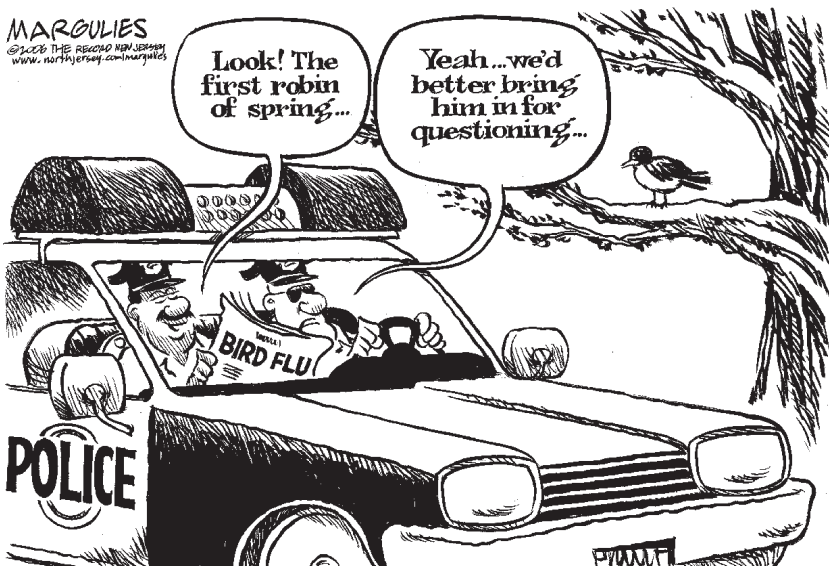
During the Korean War, the U.S. Army pioneered the "medical evacuation" technology we now commonly refer to as MEDEVAC. This rapid transportation system would bring wounded soldiers from the front lines to semi-permanent field hospitals where they could receive medical treatment after only a short helicopter flight. The Maryland State Police Aviation Command instituted the first civilian MEDEVAC in the U.S. in the late 1970's. It is now commonly used nationwide.

During both Desert Storm I and II, the development of blood-clotting bandages and the LSTAT patient care platform were introduced. Like the sophisticated military aircraft after which it was modeled, the LSTAT is an integrated system of devices in a portable intensive care unit the size of a stretcher, with a state-of-the-art defibrillator, ventilator, suction, three-channel fluid and drug infusion pump, point-of-care blood chemistry analyzer, and patient monitoring subsystems. The patient's vital statistics are transmitted to the hospital directly to the awaiting medical personnel.

Developed initially for the U.S. military, the LSTAT has improved the chances of saving a wounded soldier by reducing risk to patients in route to treatment. LSTAT will also now help alleviate hospital overcrowding and increase our ability to save lives in a mass disaster scenario.

The federal government, through such agencies as the National Institutes of Health and the Department of Defense, continues to invest in medical advances through research and development in industry and academia. In turn, industry commercializes many of these military advances, bringing their life-saving benefits to millions more people around the world.

We should all be grateful for the sacrifices our military men and women willingly undergo to protect the freedoms we have as Americans. Whether they serve as a soldier on the front lines or as a medic saving the lives of the wounded, those who serve are saving lives in our communities.

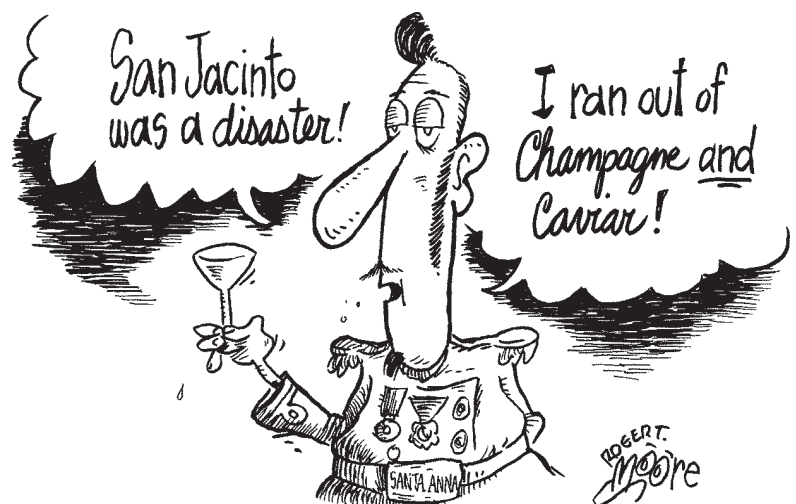

cancer under the sun and early detection is the surest way to cure it. It is estimated that approximately 950,000 Americans develop skin cancer every year. The principal cause is almost

universally accepted to be overexposure to sunlight, especially when it results in sunburn and blistering. While the hot El Paso sun is an asset in many ways, it can be dangerous. Prevention by limiting exposure to the sun and harmful ultraviolet rays is the best defense. Fortunately skin cancers are relatively easy to detect and most can be cured. Even malignant melanoma, if

caught in its early stages, can be treated successfully. If you have any growth, mole, sore or skin discoloration that has appeared suddenly, don't take any chances. Take the time to have it checked out. Del Sol Regional Oncology Center at 10460 Vista Del Sol will hold a "Free Skin Cancer Screening" event on May 20, from 8 a.m. to noon. 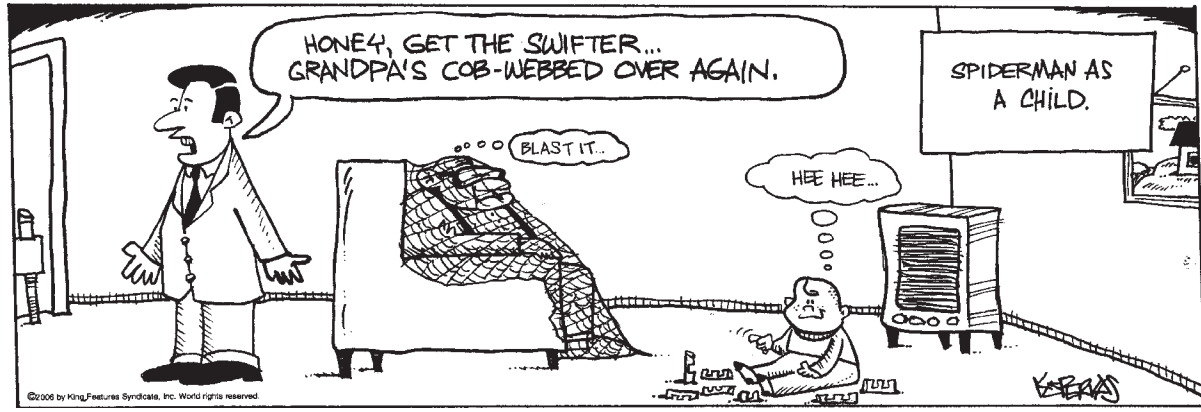

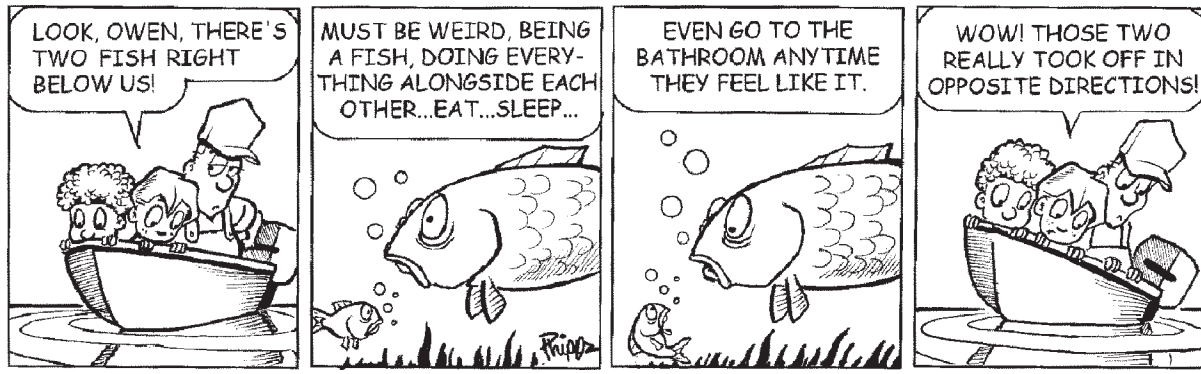

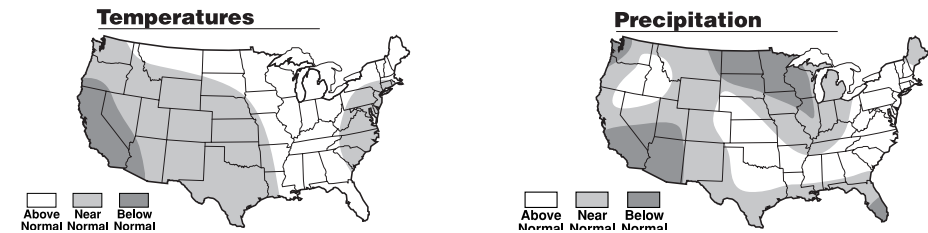
